#### **DINOSAURS AND SCIENCE INCURSIONS**

#### SCHOOL UPGRADE

Recently we learned, that due to the huge increase in the cost of building materials, the full rebuild/refurbishment of the school is not attainable within the allocated budget. So the project has had to be scaled back somewhat. Now the scope of works will include the refurbishment of all existing classrooms, the addition of one new classroom and the conversion of one classroom into a new library. The creation of a new administration wing, including offices, staffroom and toilets will now be deferred until a new allocation of funds is made, some time into the future. It's unfortunate that the whole project, as originally envisaged, can't be completed, but at least all students at Strathmerton Primary will be accommodated in fresh, new and modern learning spaces.

### **SUNSMART**

It seems incongruous to be talking about hats for outdoor wear at school, when it is so grey and wet at the moment, but Department rules are that all students must wear an approved hat whilst outdoors, during Terms One and Four each year.
