Therefore all Strathmerton Primary students will return together on that Monday. I know that all our staff are so excited at this prospect, and I'm sure our students and parents feel the same way.

TO REPEAT OR NOT REPEAT

Whether a student should repeat a year level at school or not, due to them underperforming, has been a question of debate for decades. This debate has come into strong focus again, following the COVID-19 restrictions and students undertaking so much 'home learning'. I know many parents/carers are concerned about their children not making enough progress during this time and are considering whether they might benefit with another year at their current year level.

Recently, I read an article written by renowned educator, Dr Helen McGrath, from the Faculty of Education at Deakin University. She has been reviewing studies conducted on this topic over recent years. The conclusions from every one of those studies is unanimous: *Repeating a year does not improve academic performance, social competency or general behaviour. On the contrary, it creates low self-esteem and a negative attitude to school, and places students at risk of further failure, increased anti-social behaviour and dropping out of school.*

We believe we have processes/programs in place to support students who require additional assistance, to enable them to reach their potential. We also believe we can accelerate the progress of all students with a consistent, uninterrupted term of classroom teaching.
