From the Principal's Desk

Dear Parents and Carers,

I have been in meetings over the last two days around the capital works funding we were allocated and the process that we need to follow to start the changes at Strathmerton.

The first part of the process is known as AMP1 (Asset Management Plan 1). This plan asks the principal to engage with the school community to get an understanding of what the community believes our vision, direction and aspirations are for the future.

I have included a survey with this newsletter, which I would appreciate you spending some time to complete, so I can consider your opinions when developing the AMP1. The \$3.686 million is going to enable Strathmerton Primary to be transformed into a modern building that will serve the staff, students and the community well into the future, so It's important that the updated and modernised school meets everyone's expectations. We have a short timeline to complete this AMP1, so I would appreciate you completing the survey and returning it to school as soon as possible. This is a once in a generation opportunity to make a significant change.

Once the AMP1 is completed, it needs to be endorsed by School Council and submitted to the Victorian Schools Building Authority for their approval. Following their approval, the next step is to begin planning what the school will actually look like.

SCHOOL PRODUCTION


