EXCITING NEWS

This week there were two announcements that I had been hoping for. We had applications in for programs we hoped to run from next year, and we were successful in getting grants for both of them.

The first announcement was that we we have been successful in obtaining a School Chaplain through the **National Schools Chaplaincy Program (NSCP)**, which is funded by the Federal Government. The role of the Chaplain is to provide welfare support and pastoral care to all our students and their families. The Chaplain is only to provide the support mentioned above, and is not to preach or alter people's values and beliefs in any way. They are basically a trained Welfare Worker and will actually work in our school for a number of hours every week.

The second announcement is that we have been funded to train one of our staff as a Maths Specialist, through the **Primary Maths and Science Specialist (PMSS)** program. This funding allows us to release this staff member to undertake professional development and then to introduce the latest 'best practice' Maths program and teaching methods across the whole school, which should see our Maths results improve even further in every class.

COMMENCEMENT OF CLASSES IN 2021.

As we have a number of new staff commencing in 2021, we felt we needed more time at the commencement of the school year to induct them all into the processes of the school, and to also refresh everyone's understanding of the Strathmerton Primary instructional model, as well as plan all of Term One's programs. As a result, School Council approved the school having two additional pupil-free days at the end of Week One. **Please note** that this means **all students** will now **commence school** on **Monday**, 1st **February**. (All Preps will have a rest day on each Wednesday, until the end of February).
