#### SCHOOL REVIEW

On Monday and Tuesday this week, the majority of our School Review was conducted. School Reviews are conducted at every school at the completion of a four-year cycle that covers the life of the Strategic Plan. In our case that Strategic Plan covered the period 2017-2020, and it set out goals and targets for the school to achieve over that time. During the review, every aspect of the school's performance is gathered and analysed, to determine the degree of success the school had in meeting those goals and targets, as well as set the direction for the new Strategic Plan.

The Review Panel consisted of Helen Ramsdale (Reviewer), Trent McCrae (Senior Education Improvement Leader), Chris McCallum and Gemma Whinray (Principals), Greg Brooks and Lisa Bramich (School Councillors), Rachel Olson (previous Learning Specialist), and of course, myself. Over the two days all our performance data was analysed, and staff, parent and student groups were interviewed, to allow everyone involved in our school community, to contribute to the process.

Overall, it was a very positive process, indicating that the school is generally performing very well. A final report from Helen will be provided to the school in the next couple of weeks and it will outline a clear direction for the school to take in creating our next Strategic Plan.

#### SCHOOL RE-BUILD

I was informed this week that architects, representing three different companies, will be visiting the school next Tuesday afternoon to have a look over the school, to help them form an impression of what the update/modernisation might entail.
