NAPLAN ASSESSMENTS

These annual tests will take place from Tuesday, 11th May, through to Thursday, 13th May (with Friday, 14th being used as a 'catch up' day, for students who may have missed one of the tests). The tests are administered to all of our Year 3 and Year 5 students, and are mostly conducted online. The tests cover Reading, Writing, Language Conventions and Numeracy. We have spent time giving the students involved some practice tests, to ensure they are familiar with the content and format, so they have the confidence to give the real tests their best shot, when the time arrives. I would ask all our parents/carers of our Year 3's and 5's, not to place any undue pressure on their children regarding their performance. Just ask them to relax and give each test 'their best shot'.

HIGH EXPECTATIONS

This week I have made it clear to the students that to be allowed to go on an excursion or to attend a camp is a privilege. With that privilege comes an expectation that they have earned the right to attend because their general behaviour and effort in class has been of an acceptable standard.
