COVID-SAFE UPDATE

We have a recorded COVID-positive case in our Year 5/6 classroom, which is a reminder that, whilst Strathmerton Primary students and staff have generally been COVID-free, we can't become complacent.

As mentioned recently, the Department recommends that all students from 8 years of age, as well as all adults, should wear a mask whilst indoors. Each classroom has boxes of masks available.

Also, we will continue to send home Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) kits at regular intervals, again with the recommendation that you test your family weekly.

Close contacts of a confirmed case are able to continue to come to school, with the provision that they must return five negative RAT results over a seven day period, and they **must** wear a mask whilst indoors.

With the large increase of COVID cases across the State, we need to ensure that we continue to maintain COVID-safe practices.

Then of course, at the beginning of Term Four, we have the free school camp at the High Country Camp in Tallangatta, for all our Year Two to Six students.

Each class will have an hour's workshop, where they will hear more about the music and dance of West Africa, as well as learn how to play their own drum (djembe).
