Among the conclusions it shows: In May, international tourists were reduced by 98% compared to the same month in 2019, 300 million fewer tourists between January and May and It is the responsibility of governments to prioritize public health and protect jobs.

Still, the study shows that 115 destinations (53% of all destinations worldwide) continue to keep their borders completely closed for tourism.
