The Open Space Works Ukraine team brings over 15 years of experience tackling complex issues across various social change sectors.

Since the onset of the full-scale invasion, our team has been focused on conducting studies in the humanitarian sector in collaboration with leading and internationally recognised research organisations, such as Ground Truth Solutions (Austria) and Humanitarian Policy Group/ODI (UK).

Civil Society Development in Ukraine





- Impact of War on Environmental CSOs Study (Sept 2022-Jan 2023): OSWU assessed the organisational development and war's impact on environmental organisations and the potential of EPAIU partners leading Ukrainian environmental CSOs.
- Evaluation of outcomes and short-term impact of the Supporting Young People to Build a More Cohesive Society (Active Citizens) Project. British Council, 2023.
- Organisational capacity assessment and organisational plans development of All-Ukrainian association of local governments and regional CSOs providing humanitarian and medical support in war- affected regions (2023-2024).

- Humanitarian Aid Perception Study (Sept 2022-July 2023): In collaboration with GTS and funded by the Disaster Emergency Committee (DEC), OSWU explored community and aid workers' perceptions of humanitarian aid in Ukraine. As an outcome of this study two reports were produced: Call for communication, collaboration, and cash: Perceptions of aid in Ukraine (March 2023) and "Keep in touch with the people." Perceptions of aid in Ukraine's changing context (July 2023);
- User Journey Experience Study (Jan-Apr 2023): OSWU explored user experiences based on perceptions of humanitarian assistance provided to Ukrainian refugees in Poland, Romania, and Moldova.
- Cash Assistance User Journey Study (Feb 2023-June 2024): OSWU, in partnership with the Collaborative Cash Delivery (CCD) Network, explored community perceptions of cash assistance in Ukraine. OSWU conducted two rounds of qualitative data collection. As an outcome of this study two reports were produced: Cash is king –if you can get it. Mapping the user journeys of cash recipients in Ukraine (July 2023) and "No-one has ever helped me like this." User journeys of cash recipients in Ukraine (December 2023). OSWU is currently implementing a third round of data collection.



- Feasibility Study of PT/BENGO Project in Ukraine focuses on the Buchansky district in Kyiv Oblast, targeting the communities of Bucha, Irpin, Makariv, and Hostomel. Conducted by Open Space Works Ukraine in November 2023-February 2024 on AWO International request, the study addresses the severe socio-economic implications for post-war recovery and community-led economic development following the russian full-scale invasion that began in February 2022. The project aims to contribute to the recovery and reconstruction of the Kyiv region, empowering targeted communities toward sustainable rehabilitation by developing and implementing executable recovery plans, promoting social cohesion and economic revitalisation, and tapping into new investment and development opportunities.
- Narratives on Ukraine's War (2023): In partnership with the Humanitarian Policy Group (HPG), OSWU focused on narratives of the humanitarian response to Ukraine's war, handling data collection, analysis, and stakeholder workshops;
- **Volkshilfe Austria Partnership (2022):** OSWU conducted a feasibility study on IDP need assessment in Lviv, trained staff on Core Humanitarian Standards, and launched humanitarian recovery projects in Kyiv and Kharkiv.
