We began working on a new strategy for the foundation, building new partnerships, and preparing initiatives that have the potential to scale our work. I feel that we are ready for more systemic change.

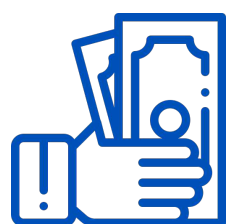

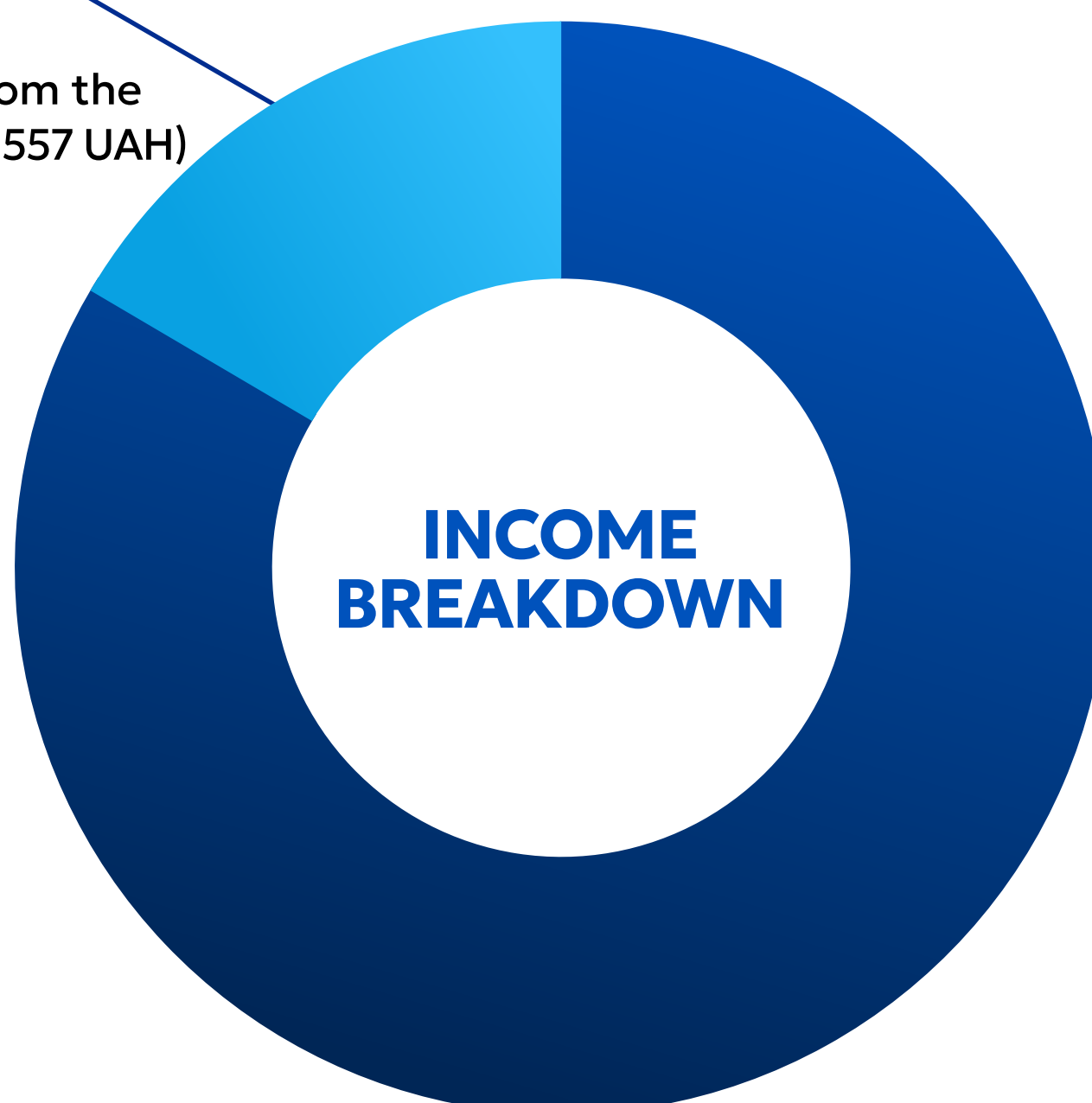

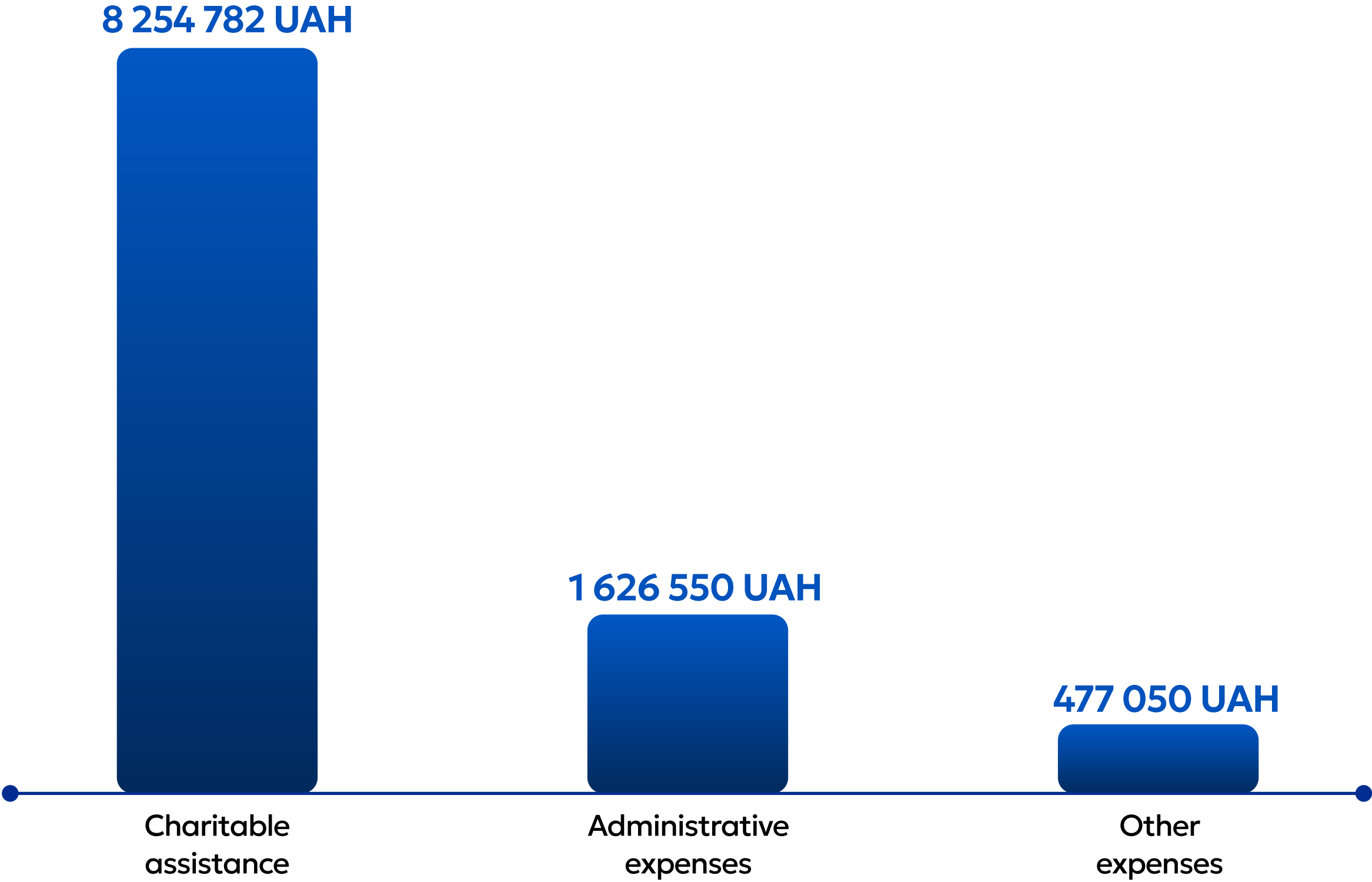

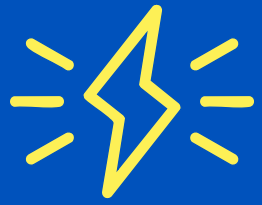

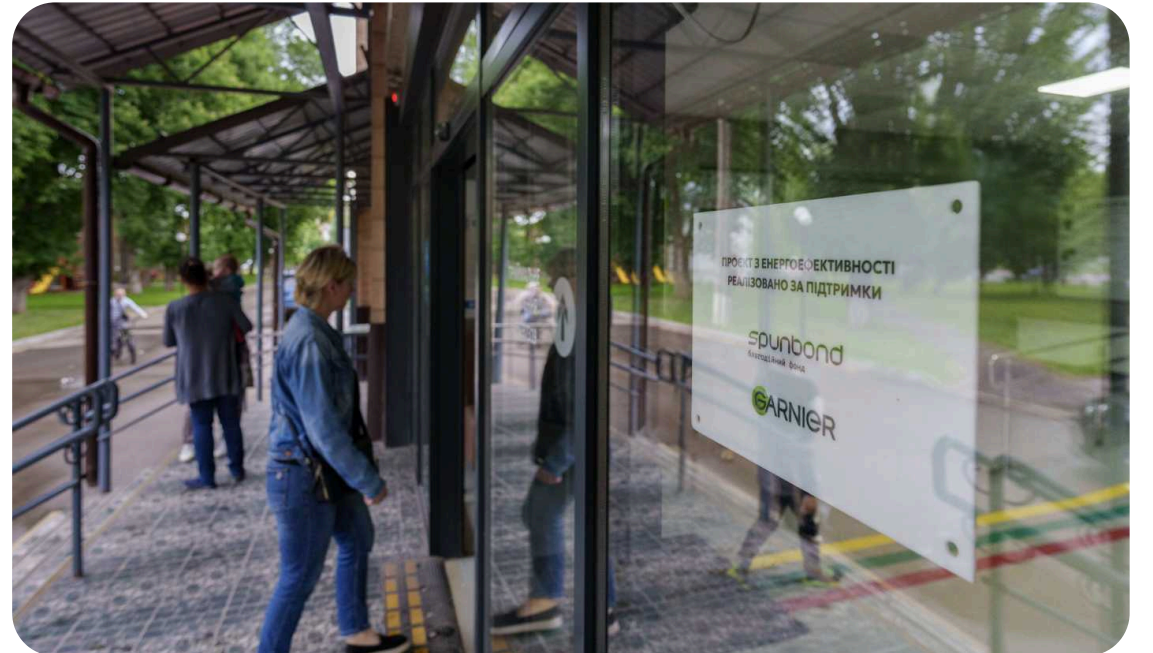

UNINTERRUPTED POWER SUPPLY



CASE OF HADIACH CITY CENTRAL HOSPITAL

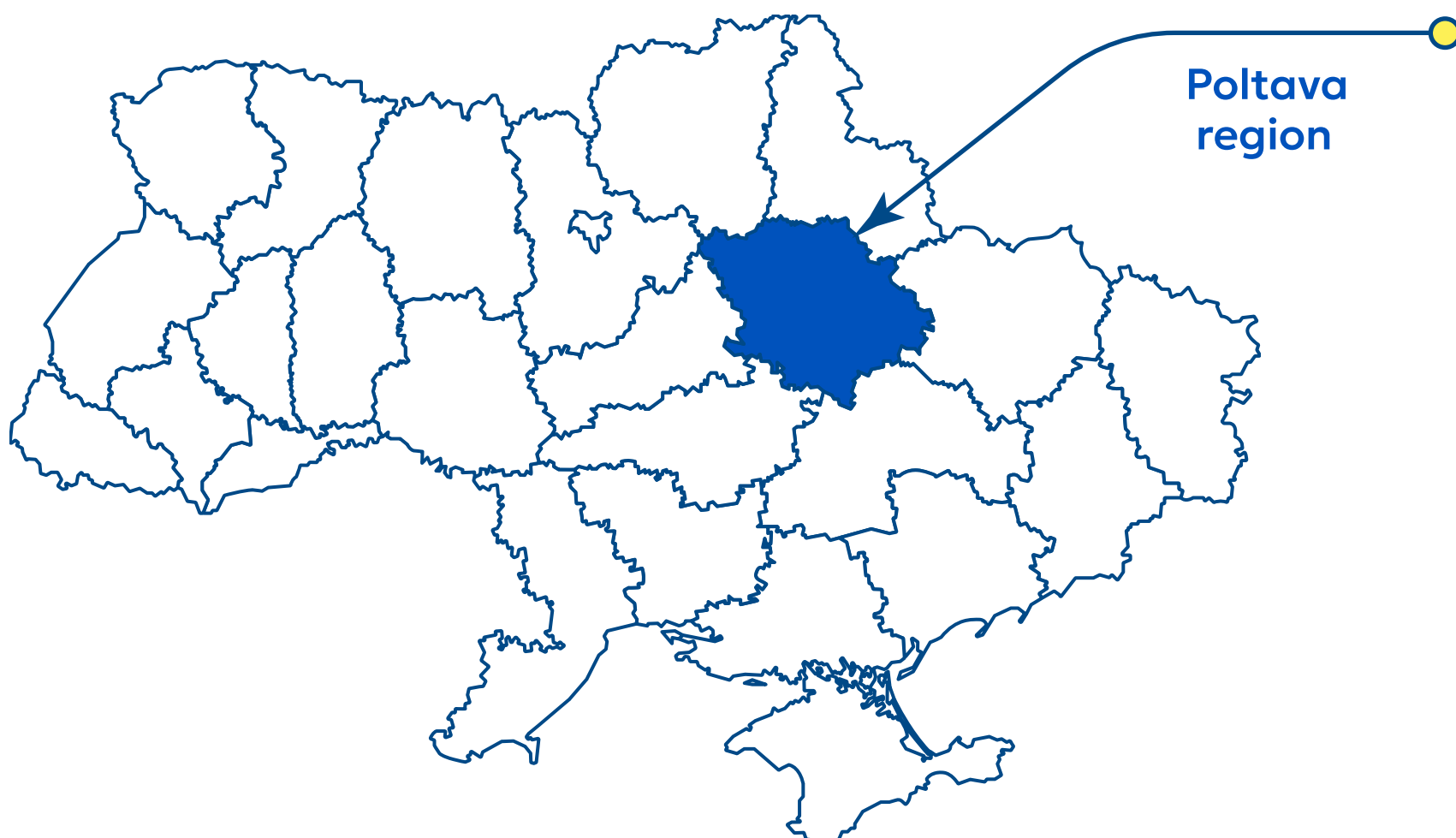
To ensure the stable operation of critical departments, a solar power system with a capacity of over 60 kW was installed at the hospital.

Hadiach City Central Hospital is a key medical institution for residents of the city of Hadiach and surrounding communities in the Poltava region, serving approximately 47,000 people. On average, the hospital provides medical care to about 572 patients daily, including emergency cases.

AS A RESULT:

- up to 10 hours of autonomous operation during power outages
- more than UAH 700,000 in annual savings
- **62 tonnes** of CO₂ emissions reduced annually
- environmental impact equivalent to around **3,000** trees preserved

The funds saved in 2025 were allocated to the renovation and arrangement of medical offices in the hospital shelter, improving patient safety and ensuring the uninterrupted operation of the medical facility.



UNINTERRUPTED POWER SUPPLY

LIGHT FOR COMMUNITIES

In 2025, the foundation began preparing a new large-scale project, “Light for Communities”, aimed at ensuring energy independence for outpatient clinics and rural health posts (FAPs) across Ukrainian communities.



The project includes the installation of solar power systems, enabling primary healthcare facilities to continue operating during power outages. Without stable electricity, outpatient clinics cannot store vaccines, use oxygen concentrators, maintain electronic patient records, or perform basic medical procedures.



In the autumn of 2025, a memorandum of cooperation was signed with the Vinnytsia Regional Council, and a memorandum with the Ministry for Communities and Territories Development of Ukraine is planned to support the further large-scale implementation of the project.

PILOT PHASE

The first stage of the project is planned to begin in 2026 in communities of the Vinnytsia region, where solar power systems will be installed in 20 outpatient clinics and rural health posts across 15 communities.

ADDRESSING TARGETED NEEDS

In 2025, the foundation continued to respond to specific requests from healthcare institutions by providing essential equipment and medical supplies, while also supporting the modernization of operating and procedure rooms.



EMERGENCY SURGERY EQUIPMENT FOR A CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL

OXYGEN FLOWMETERS, HUMIDIFIERS, AND PATIENT WARMING SYSTEMS



**Emergency Surgery Department,
National Children's Specialized
Hospital "Okhmatdyt"**

This equipment ensures precise oxygen delivery, protects patients' airways, and helps maintain body temperature during surgical procedures and intensive care.

Okhmatdyt is the largest children's hospital in Ukraine, performing more than 13,500 surgeries each year, most of which belong to the highest level of complexity.

OPERATING ROOM EQUIPMENT

LAPAROSCOPIC SURGERY EQUIPMENT, MEDICAL FURNITURE, STERILIZATION AND INFUSION THERAPY SYSTEMS, SAFE ANESTHESIA EQUIPMENT, AND MEDICAL SUPPLIES



Ukrainian Center for Motherhood and Childhood, National Academy of Medical Sciences of Ukraine



Two operating rooms and a dressing room were equipped to ensure treatment for children evacuated from Okhmatdyt after the missile strike.

Following the missile strike on the National Children's Specialized Hospital "Okhmatdyt," some patients were urgently evacuated to other medical institutions in Kyiv, including the Ukrainian Center for Motherhood and Childhood of the National Academy of Medical Sciences of Ukraine.

MEDICAL EQUIPMENT SUPPLY AND OPERATING ROOM SETUP



ANESTHESIA WORKSTATION FOR THE OPERATING ROOM

Hadiach City Central Hospital

The hospital performs more than 2,500 surgeries each year. The anesthesia workstation ensures precise delivery of oxygen and anesthetic agents and enables surgical procedures for patients of different ages.

The new equipment improves the safety of surgical procedures, strengthens anesthesia care, and enhances the quality of medical services for patients in the community.



A NEW STAGE OF THE FOUNDATION'S DEVELOPMENT

In 2025, the foundation's director Oleksandra Karpenko was selected to participate in the Civil Society Leadership Programme for Ukraine, an international leadership development program for civil society representatives implemented by NGO Academy and the ERSTE Foundation.



During two weeks in Austria, participants worked on strengthening their management skills, strategic thinking, and the institutional capacity of their organizations. The program included training modules and meetings with leading institutions and social initiatives, and was implemented with the support of the Vienna University of Economics and Business (WU).

Participation in the program became an important milestone in the foundation's development. The new knowledge, experience of international partners, and exchange with other Ukrainian organizations provided momentum for rethinking approaches to management, partnerships, and strategic planning.



A NEW STAGE OF THE FOUNDATION’S DEVELOPMENT

In 2025, the foundation’s team focused on rethinking and strengthening the organization’s strategic development.

Throughout the year, work was carried out to identify new growth opportunities for the foundation, update its mission and vision, and define the strategic focus and long-term development strategy.

An important part of this process was a series of coaching sessions and consultations with leading international experts in the field of civil society development, which helped the team take a structured approach to shaping new management practices and strategic decisions.

At the same time, the team began actively engaging with new partners and stakeholders, while also preparing for institutional changes that will enable the foundation to work more systematically and scale its projects.

The results and the foundation’s updated development strategy will be presented in 2026.
