What does the education system in the UK look like?



Primary School

- Age: 4 11
- Full-time (M-F)
- Cost: Free

Important:

<u>Year 5</u> Sep-Oct – Open door dates

<u>Year 6</u>

Sept-Oct – application time Sept – grammar schools test Mar – results May – SATs





Secondary School

- Age: 11 16 or
 11 18 (if there is a 6th Form)
- Full-time (M-F)
- Cost: Free



Important:

<u>Year 10</u> Oct-Nov – Open door dates 6th Form

<u>Year 11</u>

Autumn – application time for 6th Form GSCE



Sixth Form

- Age: 16 18
- Part-time or full-time
- Cost: Free

Further Education College

- Age: 16+ (incl adults)
- Part-time or full-time
- Cost: 16 18 Free, 19+ Fee

A-Levels

Level 3 qualification, traditional route to post-school entry to university. 3 A-Levels

all courses fully funded (free education for under 18s)

19-23 most courses fully funded (issues at Level 2)



some courses fully funded (issues at Level 3)

How to choose a course?

- Research: work backwards, University Entry Requirements
 (UCAS example, National Career Service: anaesthetist, auditor, solicitor)
- Appointment with Careers Adviser
- Attend college open days
- Don't worry about others

What to bring to enrolment?



Proof of immigration status

(e.g. ARC card, BRP card, Bail 201 letter)



Proof of income

(Universal Credit, wage slips, NASS support/ Section 95, ASPEN card)



Proof of current address (GP letter, Home Office letter)



Proof of previous qualifications

(any certificates from previous education)
