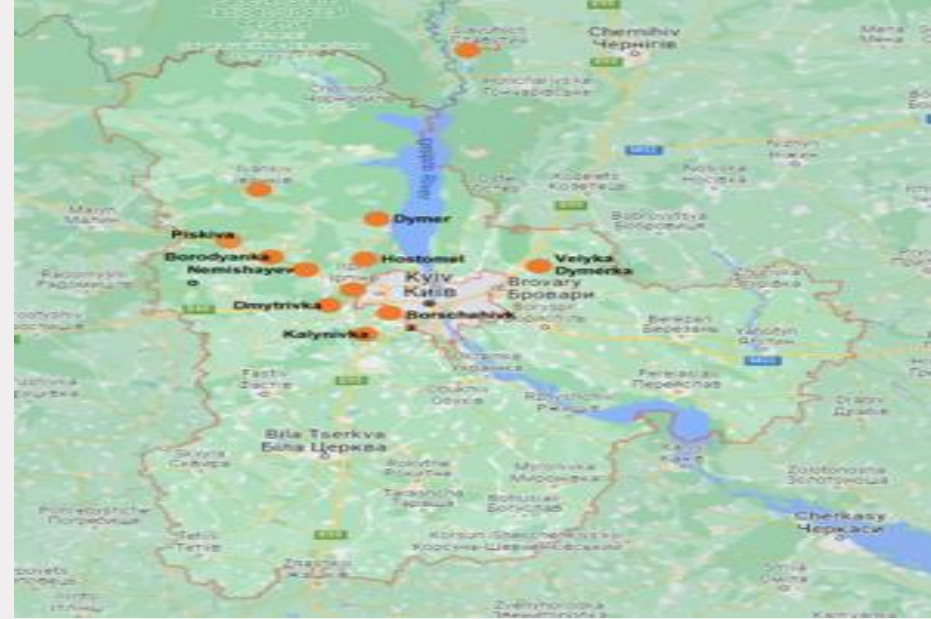

# EU4 Resilient Regions: improved local governance and better social and health services



Emergency measures for civilian population (procurement of batteries, generators, water filtering systems, first aid kits ...)

Rapid infrastructure measures (modular housing for 240 IDPs in Chernivtsi)

Equipment for healthcare institutions and social and administrative service delivery  
First aid and psychosocial training and services (MHPSS to 2 000 IDPs and other war-affected persons)



Establishing 17 IDP integration hubs in 8 regions
