For seven months, until the liberation of the Right Bank of the Kherson region, the entire Novovorontsovka community was effectively on the front line. Today, the enemy continues to terrorize the settlements of our community with constant attacks, as our lands now border the temporarily occupied territories of the Left Bank of Kherson through the former Kakhovka Reservoir.









As a result, there has been damage to critical infrastructure, particularly water supply. During the period of active hostilities, the water supply system suffered damage and destruction, and all municipal equipment was damaged and became unusable.









The issue of water supply has become particularly acute in the administrative center of the community. After the occupying forces blew up the Kakhovka Hydroelectric Power Plant, the water level in the wells that supplied the administrative center of the community critically dropped, making it impossible to draw water from them.









However, immediately after the catastrophe caused by the aggressor country, we began to look for ways to resolve this problem. One of the solutions was drilling new wells to provide centralized water supply to the administrative center. Thanks to cooperation with UNICEF, this became possible, as they financed the drilling of 5 new boreholes in Novovorontsovka.





Thanks to the support of UNICEF, a new borehole has been drilled in the village of Myrolubivka in our community. The new borehole is already connected to the village's water supply system and provides access to water for approximately 250 residents. Plans are in place to equip the borehole with a solar-powered system to provide independent power supply. This will be possible thanks to UNICEF's support.









We plan to continue our fruitful collaboration with UNICEF. Specifically, in one of our community's villages, Lyubymivka, there are plans to clean and equip the borehole that supplies the settlement. It was damaged due to Russian armed aggression. In this way, at least 700 residents of Lyubymivka will have access to stable, quality centralized water supply.





In the village of Novovoskresenske, we plan to drill a new borehole with the support of UNICEF, as residents are currently facing a shortage of centralized water supply. Additionally, we plan to deepen the existing borehole at the local medical facility to ensure its uninterrupted water supply. A solar power system will also be installed to provide independent electricity supply. In this way, approximately 750 residents of the village will have access to water.





Simultaneously, a project was implemented to clean and restore ancient wells in Novovorontsovka, which had been abandoned for more than 100 years. With our own efforts, we cleared them of debris and removed dozens of trailers full of waste. We involved friendly public organizations in designing and financing the work.





In total, 10 wells in Novovorontsovka were equipped to draw technical water. These wells do not depend on electricity. The total cost of the work exceeded 1.2 million UAH.
