The full-scale war has significantly increased the number of people who are injured and need rehabilitation after stabilisation and treatment

As of 2024, a significant number of people in Ukraine need rehabilitation, especially due to the effects of the war. According to the Ministry of Health, about 85,000 patients received free inpatient rehabilitation care in the first eight months of 2024.

of respondents (every third respondent) reported that they personally or their family members/friends had been injured, had their health or illness

6% had personal experience.

40% (among IDPs) had such experience

During the war, which creates a huge number of victims, the need for rehabilitation increases.

Defenders whose lives have been saved should not suffer from immobilisation complications and should receive rehabilitation assistance as early as possible, from the first days after injuries and illnesses

Almost 10,000 rehabilitation sessions are held daily, which indicates a significant increase in the need for such services compared to previous years. The majority of patients have physical and mental disorders caused by injuries or psychological trauma from the war.



In the Poltava region and at the community level, as in many other regions, the situation also requires the active development of rehabilitation centres and access to services for people affected by the war. The priority is a comprehensive approach to rehabilitation, including medical, social and psychological services



The social programs for the period 2023-2025 include significant measures to rehabilitate veterans and their families. It is expected that the number of people in need of rehabilitation will increase, especially among combatants and internally displaced persons who have been injured or disabled as a result of the war
