## COMMUNITY PROFILE: ECONOMIC AND HUMAN CAPITAL AS THE BASIS OF SOCIETY

#### **Geography and population:**

Area: 712.8 sq. km.

Pre-War Population: 115.7 thousand people.

#### **Economic potential:**

Industrial Base: 163 enterprises (3 large, 23 medium-sized). Human Capital: 6,638 small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) and entrepreneurs (5,219 individual entrepreneurs).

#### Social infrastructure:

Developed Social Network: 23 schools, 20 kindergartens, 4 medical facilities.





# CRISIS: OCCUPATION, ECONOMIC AND HUMAN LOSSES





**Occupation**: Siverskodonetsk Urban Territorial Community has been under occupation since June 25, 2022.

**Scale of Destruction**: over 80% of critical infrastructure is destroyed or significantly damaged.

**Human Capital Loss**: massive outflow of qualified specialists and administrative staff.

Economic losses: complete shutdown of the industrial sector and 6,638 small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs).





# THE CHALLENGE: CRITICAL NEEDS OF THE DISPLACED COMMUNITY









**Housing**: the main need of IDPs in the context of relocation is the provision of permanent housing. Safe housing is needed for the 1,500+ residents of our community.

Job Creation: it is necessary to create economic anchors that will generate at least 100 new jobs, in order to preserve human resource potential and contribute to increasing revenues to the community

budget. **Healthcare**: ensuring institutional continuity by restoring modern healthcare services.

Veteran, Military, and Children's Needs: creation of a social cohesion center for psychological and medical rehabilitation of veterans and implementation of health programs for children.









# OUR STRATEGY: THREE ANCHOR PROJECTS FOR INSTITUTIONAL CONTINUITY

RESPONSE TO THE CRISIS: WE ARE IMPLEMENTING THREE COMPREHENSIVE, PRIORITY PROJECTS THAT SERVE THE FOUNDATION FOR COMMUNITY VIABILITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- **Project 1**: Social Cohesion Center and investment in human capital (focus: rehabilitation, children's health, job creation, and retention of specialists).
- 02
- **Project 2**: renovation of healthcare facilities (focus: barrier-free access, diagnostics, and compliance with IT standards).

- **Project 3**: providing housing and a social center for the community (focus: permanent housing, education, social and administrative services).







Systemic recovery: creating systemic rehabilitation for veterans and IDPs, alongside children's wellness programs. 02

**Economic base**: guaranteed creation of 50-

60 permanent jobs to support the relocated community and ensure increased revenues to the local budget.

Long-term integration:

re-equipment of cottages for long-term residence of critical administrative and medical staff from the Siverskodonetsk Urban Territorial Community.

#### PROJECT 1:

## "LISOVA DACHA" - A CENTER FOR SOCIAL COHESION AND VETERANS' RECOVERY, AND CHILDREN'S WELLNESS

**Goal**: to create a permanent community center for communication and rehabilitation of veterans and IDPs, recovery of children, and preservation of the Siverskodonetsk identity.

**Focus**: preserving social cohesion, trust in community institutions, and the Siverskodonetsk identity.

**Location & base**: located in a safe zone in the Zakarpattia Oblast. Total area 8-10 hectares with administrative and health-improving buildings and premises.







## OBJECTIVES: SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT AND REHABILITATION









#### Infrastructure modernization:

arrangement and reconstruction of all residential cottages and main buildings to ensure year-round operation and energy efficiency.

#### Creation of rehabilitation modules:

equipping specialized spaces for psychological, social and physical rehabilitation, adapted for veterans and children affected by war.

#### **Economic anchor & long-term**

potential: ensuring long-term financial sustainability by creating 50-60 jobs, developing a "green" component (supporting local small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs)), and ensuring the operational self-sufficiency of the center and organizing activities and spaces for community residents.

## INVESTMENT COST AND FINANCING OPPORTUNITIES

**Total estimated cost**: 1,000,000,000 UAH / 21,000,000 € (for complete modernization of the complex, including all facilities and infrastructure on an area of 8-10 hectares).

**Critical funding focus**: ensuring investment in a social cohesion center for systemic recovery for veterans and civilians and psychosocial support for IDP children, supporting human capital resilience and long-term community integrity.









#### Focus on modernization:

reconstruction and filling of the facility with equipment that meets modern standards and safety requirements for barrierfree access. 02

### Critical need being addressed:

restoration of specialized services (mammography, rehabilitation, etc.) vital for the displaced population.

## PROJECT 2: RENOVATION AND EXPANSION OF THE RELOCATED SIVERSKODONETSK HOSPITAL

**Goal**: to ensure institutional continuity of the healthcare system of the Siverskodonetsk Urban Territorial Community and provide high-quality medical diagnostic and rehabilitation services for internally displaced persons (IDPs) in the city of Ukrainka.

**Institutional continuity**: the hospital is already operating at its new location, staffed by relocated specialists from Siverskodonetsk who are ready to treat patients.







# OBJECTIVES: MODERNIZATION AND BARRIER-FREE ACCESS



01

Creation of an inclusive rehabilitation module: complete reconstruction of existing premises for physical and psychological recovery, including VR therapy areas.

02

**Key diagnostics upgrade:** reconstruction of X-ray and CT scanning rooms, ensuring modern radiation protection standards.

03

**Full barrier-free access:** installation of ramps,

elevators and adapted bathrooms to comply with European accessibility standards (inclusive for IDPs and veterans).






### OBJECTIVES: WOMEN'S HEALTH AND DIGITAL RESILIENCE









**Purchase of a digital mammography device**: purchase of a modern digital mammography device to ensure early cancer detection and high-quality screening for women in the displaced community.

#### **Secure IT infrastructure:**


purchase of server and network equipment to ensure data security (HIPAA/GDPR compliance) and efficient operation of the electronic medical records system.

### **Expansion of existing rehabilitation facilities**:

modernizing and equipping the current physical therapy room to enhance recovery programs for IDPs and veterans.

## INVESTMENT COST AND FINANCING OPPORTUNITY

**Total estimated cost**: 36,500,000 UAH / 747,396.99 €.

**Critical funding focus**: restoring services with the highest social impact and lowest current availability.









Addresses a critical need: directly addresses a major obstacle to community survival - the lack of safe, modern, long-term housing. 02

#### **Comprehensive resilience:**

the project ensures high standards of physical safety and inclusion for all residents, including families with children and veterans.

## PROJECT 3: "THE RENAISSANCE QUARTER" - HOUSING AND SOCIAL CORE

**Goal**: to create safe, permanent housing for 512 families (approximately 1,536 residents) and restore the social core necessary to support critical staff and repatriate internally displaced persons (IDPs).

**Location**: the Renaissance Quarter is being built in the city of Ukrainka, Kyiv Oblast.







## OBJECTIVES: SECURITY, RESILIENCE AND AUTONOMY









#### Integrated safety infrastructure:

construction of modern bomb shelters to guarantee the physical safety of all 1,536 residents.

#### **Quality housing provision:**

construction of 512 quality apartments with high standards of thermal efficiency and comfort for long-term residence.

#### **Energy independence and resilience:**

implementation of solar energy and energy-efficient building technologies to provide autonomous: heating, water supply, and electricity during blackouts.








## INVESTMENT COST AND FINANCING OPPORTUNITY

**Total estimated cost**: 2 694 100 000 UAH / 56 009 824,95 €. With the possibility of phased project implementation.

**Key impact:** this comprehensive investment provides safe housing for 1,536 people and ensures the institutional continuity of the Siverskodonetsk community.

The three projects operate as an integrated system that ensures the three main pillars of sustainable community resilience - safe housing, critical infrastructure, and systematic rehabilitation - forming a solid foundation for renewal and revival.
