



Jessy De Smet, born in Zottegem (BE) in 1976, has been one of the most recognizable voices in Belgian music for over three decades. In the 1990s, she broke through as the frontwoman of The Mackenzie feat. Jessy with timeless classics like Innocence, Falling in Love and All I Need. Above all, Innocence has grown into a song considered almost cultural heritage in Belgium today.

In **2001**, **Jessy** launched her **solo career** and wrote the song that would change her life forever: **Look at Me Now**. It became not only a smash hit in Belgium but also her **international breakthrough**. Thanks to that song, she is still invited almost **every weekend** to perform in **Spain**. **Highlights** include the **Love the Twenties** mega festivals, held twice a year and drawing more than 30,000 ecstatic fans each time.

Jessy went on to write hits that consistently reached a wide audience. Rain, Glorious and Emotions (Don't Stop) confirmed her versatility and craftsmanship as a songwriter. In 2006, she released her own song Dancing in the Dark in collaboration with Mickey Modelle. It became a huge success in the United Kingdom and Ireland, making Jessy a beloved artist there as well. To this day, she is invited back almost monthly to perform in the UK.

In the years that followed, Jessy continued to release new music that kept her fans engaged. In 2010, she returned to the **Belgian** charts with **Missing**, followed by striking collaborations with DJ Rebel on Think About the Way and Angel (2011). A year later, she gave new life to her classic with **Innocence 12**, which again received **massive** radio airplay. Further releases such as Impossible (2012), the successful Nothing at All (2013), and Beautiful (2014) confirmed her enduring relevance. Later, she continued surprising with tracks like Fly Away (2017), the warm Christmas duet Christmas Time (2019) with her mother Rita, and Reality (2020), a collaboration with DJ Xquizit & Osito. Each release showed that **Jessy never stopped** creating and always **stayed musically active**.

In 2023, Jessy shifted her focus back to Belgium with the release of Heartbeat, which received strong airplay on Radio 2. It marked the beginning of a new phase in her career, reconnecting her with a broad national audience. A year later, she shined on national television, performing the original 1990s version of Innocence on the legendary show Tien Om Te Zien. The performance was a resounding success and sparked a new wave of attention.

That momentum led directly to perhaps the most beautiful chapter of her career: in September 2025, Jessy reached the super final of national tv station VTM's Sing Again. There, Flanders discovered her versatility – not only the dance diva but also an artist capable of moving audiences deeply with her voice. It finally gave her the national recognition her fans had long been waiting for.

Today, more than twenty-five years after her first big breakthrough, Jessy still performs on international stages every weekend, from Spain to the United Kingdom. Her tour schedule is fuller than ever, her hits remain timeless, and her voice continues to unite generations.
