COURSE OBJECTIVES

Project management approaches, models, methods, tools and techniques are introduced in this course. Students will discover the project life cycle and learn how to deliver value from project initiation to completion. You will learn to:

- Develop the skills to clearly define the scope and objectives of a project
- Acquire the ability to break down project objectives into concrete activities or work packages
- Identify the necessary resources for each project activity or work package
- Develop the skills to create a comprehensive project plan that encompasses all necessary tasks, resources, timelines, and dependencies
- Understand the risk management process, including the identification, assessment, and mitigation of potential risks that may impact project success
- Acquire the ability to monitor and control project execution, implementing appropriate measures to track progress, address issues, and maintain project alignment with objectives
- Comprehend the structure and requirements of a capstone project defense presentation
