- learning to use a wheelchair

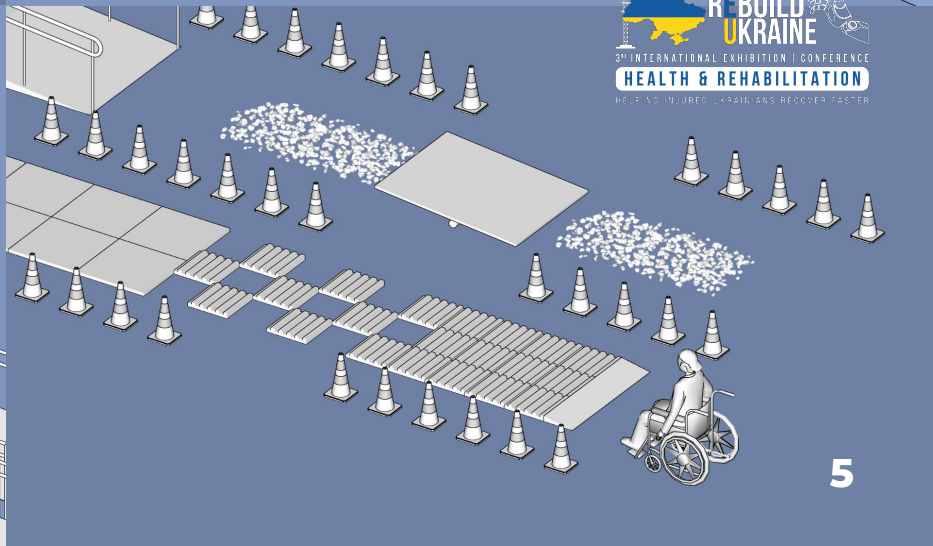
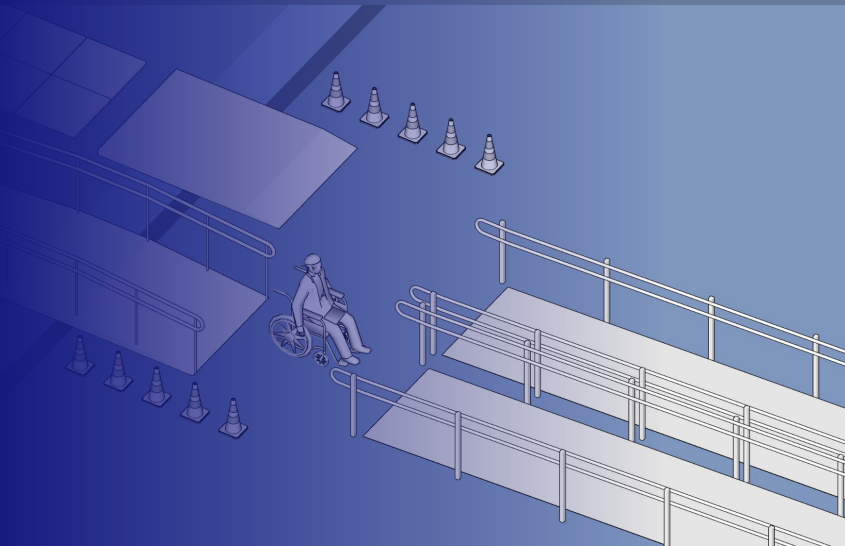
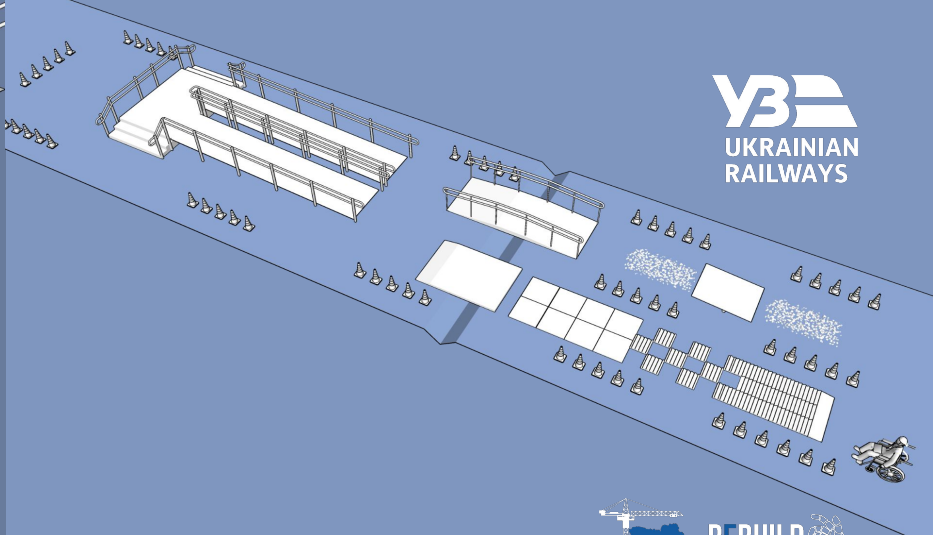
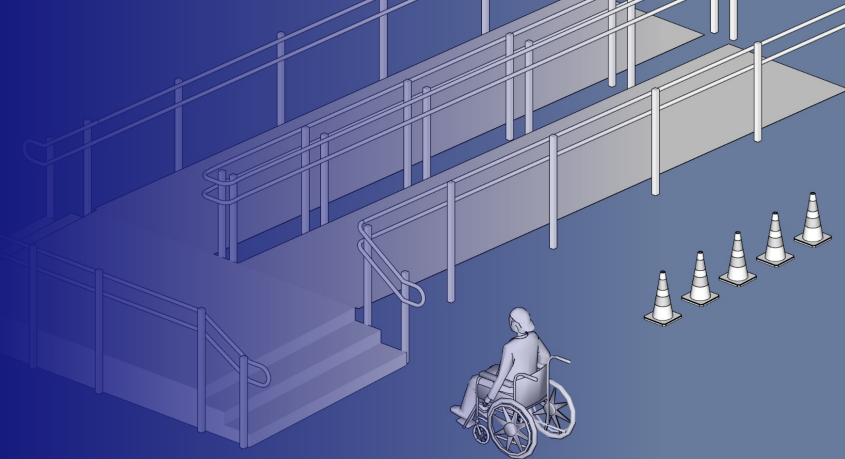


GOAL

RESULTS

1. A functioning center with conditions for the joint stay of veterans with disabilities and their family members.
2. Training and psychological preparation of the target audience regarding the arrangement of family space and strategies for overcoming challenges in civilian life, including trauma and the specifics of disability.
