

Recovery and support: rehabilitation center in Volodymyr



The city of Volodymyr is the permanent location of the 14th separate mechanized brigade named after Roman Veliky, 39th anti-aircraft missile regiment, military unit A4308. Three border outposts also carry out military service here. Even before the full-scale invasion, the number of servicemen living in the city amounted to more than 12 thousand people. Now this number has significantly increased.



The Volodymyr TMA operates a physical rehabilitation department with 30 beds, which provides qualified outpatient and inpatient medical care. The main areas of rehabilitation are neurorehabilitation and musculoskeletal rehabilitation, cardiorehabilitation and rehabilitation for respiratory diseases.



The reality of our present dictates the need to create a separate and powerful rehabilitation center for servicemen who suffered as a result of the hostilities of Russian aggression and other population groups that need appropriate assistance.



Since the beginning of the full-scale invasion, 2,800 servicemen have been treated in Volodymyr hospital.



The goal of the project is to provide comprehensive medical, psychological and social support to servicemen, veterans and their families through the creation of a modern rehabilitation center that will contribute to their physical and mental recovery, as well as successful integration into civilian life.



The main tasks of the project:

- Build and equip a rehabilitation center with modern equipment, including robotic systems for training and assessment of gait.
- Provide appropriate infrastructure for a comfortable stay of patients and their families.
- Attract highly qualified medical workers, rehabilitators, psychologists and social workers.



- Develop an information campaign to raise awareness of available center services.





- Develop individual treatment and rehabilitation plans for each patient, taking into account his characteristics and needs.
- Implement programs of physical rehabilitation, psychological support and social adaptation.

- Implement systems for monitoring and evaluating the effectiveness of rehabilitation programs and procedures.
- Regularly assess patient progress and adjust rehabilitation plans based on results.
- Provide professional psychological help to overcome post-traumatic stress and other psychological problems.
- Create support and therapy groups for veterans and their families.



- Organize professional training and retraining courses for veterans.
- Promote the employment of veterans and their integration into the community.



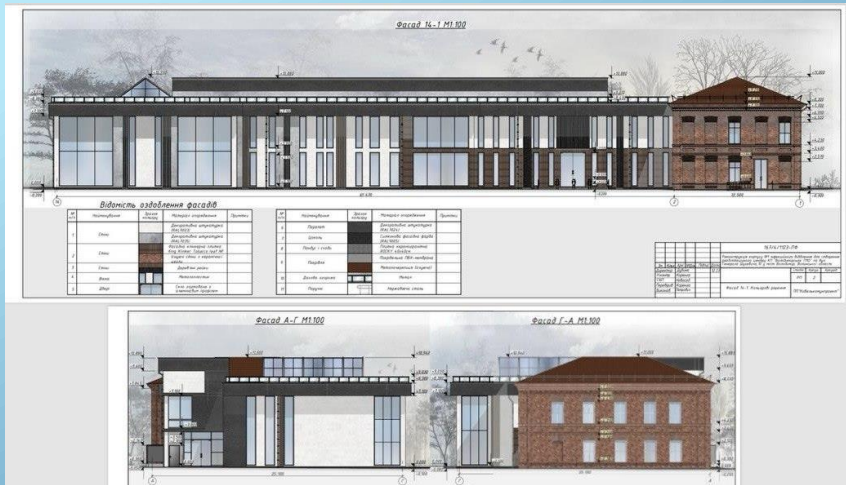
- Establish partnerships with government institutions, public organizations and businesses to support the center's activities.
- Attract charitable and international organizations to finance and support the project.
- Provide training and advanced training of personnel to work with modern equipment and methods.



The new center provides comfortable wards for temporary stay of patients with 50 beds, rooms for physical rehabilitation, rooms for hardware physiotherapy, hydrotherapy, rooms for occupational therapy, rooms for assistive technologies and the selection of prostheses, rooms for manual procedures, a consulting polyclinic for narrow specialists and rooms for individual group psychological assistance, laboratory and instrumental diagnostics.



The sum of the consolidated estimate of the object is 2,5 mln €. The total cost of the center is expected > 4.5 mln €.



Reconstruction work on this facility has already begun. But there are still many tasks and challenges ahead. We are convinced that with the support of international partners we will be able to implement such an important project for our country today.
