St. Paul Lutheran Church Foundation

26 years ago, 5 members from St. Paul Church signed the Articles of Incorporation to create The St. Paul Lutheran Church Foundation. Ivan Eckholm, Alan Katterhenry, Jean Zanton, Dan Bertelsen, and Howard Rasmussen had an idea to focus on legacy giving and grow a foundation for St. Paul.

We now have a long-term, stable endowment fund that provides distributions to grow St. Paul ministry today and well into the future. This year St. Paul Foundation contributed to the elevator fund, CARITAS, the pastoral care fund, and the $150^{\rm th}$ celebration.

With generous giving to the Foundation, we can continue to provide for God's work in the years to come.

Did you know individuals aged 72 (or 70 ½ prior to January 2020) may donate to charity annually through their traditional Individual Retirement Accounts? The donation must be made directly from the IRA plan administrator to the qualified charity, such as St. Paul Lutheran Church Foundation! These distributions can count toward your "required minimum distribution" (RMD), which would normally be taxable when distributed to you.

Special Congregational Meeting

A special meeting is being called by the council to discuss and provide information to the call committee in selecting the next pastoral leader of St. Paul. Your input is necessary to help determine the direction of St. Paul during the coming years. A letter is being sent to all St. Paul members. Please read the letter and attend the meeting. Thank you.

St Paul Lutheran Foundation Committee in accordance with the Foundation by-laws is accepting requests for grants in the amount of \$500.00-\$1,000.00 for the purpose of using toward community outreach, ministry partners and/or toward one general budget item. All members of the congregation are welcome to apply for a grant. A written proposal explaining what the funds will be used for and accounted for is due November 30, 2024. The Foundation committee will notify grantees on December 15, 2024. Grant awards will be disbursed January 2,2025. Grantees have 1 year to use the funds as proposed. Accounting of funds must be reported.

The by-laws of the Foundation state that 10% of assets at the beginning of the current year (2024) plus earnings from the past year (2023) may be distributed by the Foundation Committee each year. St. Paul Care Closet

The Care Closet was established in 2023 with the support of Pastor Lucy Wynard so that St. Paul would be a resource for our neighbors and community members in their time of need.

The Care Closet provides things such as blankets, sleeping bags, tents, socks (and other clothing items), laundry packets, personal care items, McDonalds food cards, gas cards and bus passes. Some of the items are donated by our congregational members. We are, also, truly fortunate to be able to partner with the "Youth2Youth 4 Change" organization that routinely donates sleeping bags, tents, laundry packets and personal care items. St Paul provides the bus passes, McDonalds food cards and gas cards. Many of the people in our community have fallen on hard times and many of the things in our care closet are given out in large numbers, including the bus passes, food cards and gas cards.

So far in **2024** we have provided **81** \$15.00 gas cards, **49** \$12.00 bus passes, and **31** \$15.00 McDonald's food cards....totaling **\$2,268.00**. The funds to buy these cards have come from congregational donations, Stateline Community Foundation Grants, a St. Paul Lutheran Church Foundation Grant, and the Pastoral Care account. We anticipate that the need will increase as cold weather approaches.

We record all the items that we give out by name of the person, and we limit the number that each person can receive. For example, with the gas cards, food cards and bus passes, each person is limited to 3 of each card in one calendar year. We are creating an ongoing Sunday Loose Change Jar to help support this program. Congregation members may still make larger donations through their giving envelopes. Just be sure to mark them for "cards" or the "Care Closet."

We are starting the **Sunday Loose Change Jar** program on October 13, 2024. Look for the jar in the back of church. We are happy to help you recycle your loose change each



week.
