St. Paul Care Closet

The Care Closet was established in 2023 with the support of Pastor Lucy Wynard so that St. Paul would be a resource for our neighbors and community members in their time of need.

The Care Closet provides things such as blankets, sleeping bags, tents, socks (and other clothing items), laundry packets, personal care items, McDonalds food cards, gas cards and bus passes. Some of the items are donated by our congregational members. We are, also, truly fortunate to be able to partner with the "Youth2Youth 4 Change" organization that routinely donates sleeping bags, tents, laundry packets and personal care items. St Paul provides the bus passes, McDonalds food cards and gas cards. Many of the people in our community have fallen on hard times and many of the things in our care closet are given out in large numbers, including the bus passes, food cards and gas cards.

So far in **2024** we have provided **81** \$15.00 gas cards, **49** \$12.00 bus passes, and **31** \$15.00 McDonald's food cards....totaling **\$2,268.00**. The funds to buy these cards have come from congregational donations, Stateline Community Foundation Grants, a St. Paul Lutheran Church Foundation Grant, and the Pastoral Care account. We anticipate that the need will increase as cold weather approaches.

We record all the items that we give out by name of the person, and we limit the number that each person can receive. For example, with the gas cards, food cards and bus passes, each person is limited to 3 of each card in one calendar year. We are creating an ongoing Sunday Loose Change Jar to help support this program. Congregation members may still make larger donations through their giving envelopes. Just be sure to mark them for "cards" or the "Care Closet."

We are starting the **Sunday Loose Change Jar** program on October 13, 2024. Look for the jar in the back of church. We are happy to help you recycle your loose change each



week.
