Grace and peace to you from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Happy New Year! Welcome to 2025. Boy do we have a lot for the new year. We are preparing for the annual meeting. We will be celebrating the baptism of our Lord, and we are moving through the season of Christmas, to the beginning of Epiphany.

That is the time where God is revealed to us, and we actually get it! It's that lightbulb over our heads lighting up moment. It's where we are taught what it means to be a disciple of the One who came to offer Himself up for us. To BE Christian, not just claim it.

This year, I would love to hear your stories of Epiphany. What moments have guided you to be Christian in your own lives? Where has it guided you to ministry? How are you following Jesus every day? And where do you hear Jesus calling you toward next?

In Luke 4, beginning at verse 16, we hear of Jesus being rejected in Nazareth. A text I will be preaching on this month. And it is Jesus reading from Isaiah. We hear, "He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind. To let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." "To bring good news to the poor."

And then He proclaims that the scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing. Yet they rejected Him. In fact, they became enraged and tried to throw Him off a cliff. In other words, they didn't get it. The lightbulb didn't go off. They did not have that Epiphany moment.

And it isn't easy for us sometimes either. The idea of releasing captives, probably won't be supported by many of us. Yet, that is what Jesus called for. The thought that Jesus speaks of Good News for the poor, and advocating for the oppressed, can leave us thinking, "what about me?" *continued next page*

Well, here is your Epiphany message for today; That is not just Jesus saying those things, it is an example for us as to who we should be. Reaching out to those on the margins of society. Offering forgiveness, and God's love. AND being willing to speak truth, even in situations that might not be friendly in receiving it.

That verse in Isaiah should be guidance for us as to what being a disciple should look like. It's not about us. It's about God's Kingdom. It's about going out, and proclaiming that this, is the year of the Lord's favor. Already given to you, so that you might share it.

So to answer the question; "what about me?" Well, you have already received. God has found you worthy to be saved. God loves you. And Jesus was born in order that you might die to sin and live in Him. And that Good News, is worth sharing. Because many out there, have never heard. Now that, my brothers and sisters, is an Epiphany. You are called, saved, and sent.

And may God be with you, until we meet again.

**St Paul Lutheran Foundation Committee** in accordance with the Foundation by-laws is accepting requests for grants in the amount of \$500.00-\$1,000.00 for the purpose of using toward community outreach, ministry partners and/or toward one general budget item.

All members of the congregation are welcome to apply for a grant. A written proposal explaining what the funds will be used for and accounted for is due November 30, 2024. The Foundation committee will notify grantees on December 15, 2024. rant awards will be disbursed January 2,2025. Grantees have 1 year to use the funds as proposed. Accounting of funds must be reported.

The by-laws of the Foundation state that 10% of assets at the beginning of the current year (2024) plus earnings from the past year (2023) may be distributed by the Foundation Committee each year.
