

The Law of Moses

- The law reveals God's character, including his justice, mercy, holiness, and grace.
- The law shows that people are sinners, spiritually dead, and separated from God.
- The law shows that people are corrupt and need forgiveness.
- The law shows that people can never keep the law.
- The law is "Weak through the flesh":
 - Implies that human beings, due to their sinful nature, are not capable of perfectly obeying the law on their own
- The Law bound a person to sacrifices
- Required repeated sacrifices, showing that it could not permanently solve the problem of sin
- The law was not flawed":
 - This signifies that the law itself was not flawed, but because of human limitations, it could not fully redeem people from sin
- To teach morality
- The law taught the Israelites God's moral code and how to live righteously.
 - To protect God's people
- The law was meant to protect the Israelites from their sinful tendencies and provide for their well-being.
- To demonstrate God's character
 - The law was a way to show the character of God as a holy and righteous being.
- To prepare for the coming of Christ
 - The law was a temporary structure that pointed to Jesus Christ, who would fulfill the law and usher in a new covenant.
- The law provided a standard
 - The law provided a standard by which people could evaluate their actions and attitudes.
