

**[Week 6]****Miracle 4****Feeds the Multitude****John 6:1-14**

Now here in [John.6:1-14] Jesus will perform his fourth miracle which will also be found in [Matt.14:13-21, Mark.6:31-44, Luke.9:10-17, & John.6:1-15] This is also the only miracle in which all four gospels tell of Jesus feeding the five thousand. Which means this particular miracle is important and will point to something about messianic prophecy and the Messiah. We will not include all readings of the accounts here, but we will use John's account only as [John. 6:1-14] says;

**1**After these things Jesus went away to the other side of the Sea of Galilee (or Tiberias). **2** A large crowd was following Him, because they were watching the signs which He was performing on those who were sick. **3**But Jesus went up on the mountain, and there He sat with His disciples. **4** Now the Passover, the feast of the Jews, was near. **5** So Jesus, after raising His eyes and seeing that a large crowd was coming to Him, said to Philip, "Where are we to buy bread so that these people may eat?" **6**But He was saying this only to test him, for He Himself knew what He intended to do. **7**Philip answered Him, "Two hundred denarii worth of bread is not enough for them, for each to receive just a little!" **8** One of His disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to Him, **9**"There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what are these for so many people?" **10**Jesus said, "Have the people recline to eat." Now there was plenty of grass in the place. So the men reclined, about five thousand in number. **11**Jesus then took the loaves, and after giving thanks He distributed them to those who were reclining; likewise also of the fish, as much as they wanted. **12**And when they had eaten their fill, He **\*said** to His disciples, "Gather up the leftover pieces so that nothing will be lost." **13**So they gathered them up, and filled twelve baskets with pieces from the five barley loaves which were left over by those who had eaten. **14**Therefore when the people saw the sign which He had performed, they said, "This is truly the Prophet who is to come into the world."

## **Miracle 5** **Walks on Water** **John 6:15-21**

This is the fifth miracle or sign performed by the Messiah and it is found directly after [John.6:1-14]. And here John's going to show us that Jesus was more than just a normal human being. And once more validating Jesus' deity and his Kingship. Now [John.6:15-21] says;

**15** So Jesus, aware that they intended to come and take Him by force to make Him king, withdrew again to the mountain by Himself, alone. **16** Now when evening came, His disciples went down to the sea, **17** and after getting into a boat, they started to cross the sea to Capernaum. It had already become dark, and Jesus had not yet come to them. **18** In addition, the sea began getting rough, because a strong wind was blowing. **19** Then, when they had rowed about twenty-five or thirty stadia, they saw Jesus walking on the sea and coming near the boat; and they were frightened. **20** But He said to them, "It is I; do not be afraid." **21** So they were willing to take Him into the boat, and immediately the boat was at the land to which they were going.
