



Prophetic Seasons

It's the month of September and according to the Hebrew calendar. It's a time when Jewish Believers and Christian will celebrate and look forward to the future coming of the Messiah. Although many of us anticipate already the Messiah fulfilling these days. But as we look at each biblical Holiday they show us three prophetic time vents.

The Moed [Appointed times]

Rosh Hashanah

(Jewish New Year): Sundown on Friday, September 11 – Nightfall on Sunday, September 13, 2026

The first fall feast is Yom Teruah, or Rosh Ha Shannah -or that is the Feast of Trumpets. We find the practice of this in the Torah in [Vayikra. Lev 23:23–25 and Numb. 29:1–6] Here the Hebrew community was instructed to rest, do no work, and make an offering unto our Lord and to gather and simply observe hearing the sound of the Shofar or the ram's horn. The Torah does not add reasoning for the Holiday only that the community needed to obey it. But from past Hebrew experience the rams horn played multiple uses especially when they Heard the voice of God at the foot of Mt Sinai for the first time as the shofar blew louder and louder. The shofar called people to gather and hear God. The shofar instructed the armies of Israel in battle; the shofar blew the walls of Jerico down. So, it is considered to be a very import object in biblical learning. As for a future snapshot of Rosh ha Shannah in the B'rit hadasha [New Covenant] We are told that at any moment we who are a part of the Messiahs community or that is the church may and can hear the sound of a shofar call at any moment as found in;

[1Thess.4:16-17]

16For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a loud command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God, and the dead in Christ will be the first to rise. 17After that, we who are alive and remain will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so, we will always be with the Lord

The Messiah will fulfill this biblical Holiday at Gods command. So, the future of the church will be joined to the Messiah when we all hear the call of the Shofar, and the resurrection of all believers will be complete. Next is

Yom Kippur

(The Day of Atonement): Sundown on Sunday, September 20 – Nightfall on Monday, September 21, 2026

This too is found in the Torah in [Vayikra. Lev. Chp.16: 23:26-32, 25:9-10] And the Hebrew community was commanded to keep this time of atonement. No work was to be done, and people would fast for the day seeking forgiveness as they waited upon the Kohen Gadol the High Priest as he atoned nationally for all Israel's Sin as he confessed them over the scape goat. When he was done he would declare the following name of Yehovah before the people, and they would know that God had forgiven their sins as they bowed low in the temple courtyard and said;

Baruch shem k'vod malchuto l'olam va'ed. -Blessed be the name of his glorious kingdom forever and ever.

While Israel thought of this process to be one for all generations forever God's plan was to make obsolete this sacrificial system and provide one Substitute sacrifice which would make that system obsolete. God did this by providing a onetime sacrifice through our Messiah. Although Yeshua did not die on the Day of Atonement, he fulfilled its sacrifice 100%. Which fulfilled that requirement for all man's sins, and he is now God's Kohen Ha'Gadol "great high priest" as he said to all Israel and man "It is finished" [Yohanan. John.19:30]. But in the near future this biblical holiday will find its final fulfillment when Yeshua saves the remnant of his people at the end of the seven-year tribulation. It is believed that Israel will cry out on the future day of atonement and beg for God to forgive them for rejection of Yeshua and then cry out for God to save and send them Yeshua [Matt.23:29]. At that time Israel will be saved as scripture says in [Rom.11:26]. We also have a great video this month about that very issue that you all must absolutely see. And Lastly

Sukkot

(Feast of Tabernacles or booths): Sundown on Friday, September 25 – Nightfall on Friday, October 2, 2026

This is the last calendar Holiday until the Spring feast in which Yeshua has already fulfilled and since he has fulfilled these there is no questions within our hearts and minds that he will no doubt fulfill the fall feast which were covering today. But now that were at our final holiday we go back to the Torah and find in [Viyikra. Lev.23:33-43, & Devarim. Deut.16:13-15] the meaning if this biblical Holiday. In Torah were told that the Hebrew community was to live in booths or sukkahs for several days as it says in;

[Lev.23:42-43]

"You shall dwell in booths for seven days. All who are native Israelites shall dwell in booths, that your generations may know that I made the children of Israel dwell in booths when I brought them out of the land of Egypt: I am the Lord your God."

And they were also to present food offerings to God and on the eighth day they were to have a gathering celebrating the eight-day called Shemini Atzeret. Today in Israel, Shemini Atzeret and **Simchat Torah** ("Rejoicing in the Law") are celebrated on the exact same day. The day is a massive celebration marking the completion and restarting of the annual Torah reading cycle. But in the past, it was a day which separated the dry season from the rainy season. There was also no work during this day was to be done. This is also the same Holiday on which our Messiah proclaimed his Messiahship by saying to the people;

[Yohanan.John.7:38]

"He that believes on me, as the scripture has said, out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water."

And looking forward from here the future of the feast of tabernacles or sukkot according to bible prophecy tells us that when the Messiah returns after the seven-year tribulation is the time that he will begin to establish his messianic Kingdom global kingdom on earth starting from the Head which will be Yerushaliyeem-Jerusalem. The prophet Zacheriah further tells us that the feast tabernacles will be a major holiday for the earth. And it says that anyone who will not honor King Messiah Yeshua on the feast of tabernacles will suffer the consequence and judgment of no blessing from the King. As they will be counted to be law breakers because the feast of tabernacles will be part of the Kings global law to honor and worship the King, no acceptations as Zacheriah put it.

[Zech. 14:17] *"And it shall be that whichever of the families of the earth do not come up to Jerusalem to worship the King, the Lord of hosts, on them there will be no rain."*

And finally, symbolically the eighth day of the feast of tabernacles is a future picture of how God after the 1000years of peace will turn his creation into an eternal habitation for all of his people as he states this in;

[Rev.21:1-5]

"Now I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away. Also, there was no more sea. Then I, John, saw the holy city, New Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband."

And I heard a loud voice from heaven saying, 'Behold, the [Sukkah]tabernacle of God is with men, and He will dwell with them, and they shall be His people. God Himself will be with them and be their God. And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes; there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying. There shall be no more pain, for the former things have passed away.' Then He who sat on the throne said, 'Behold, I make all things new.' And He said to me, 'Write, for these words are true and faithful.'"

Our Encouragement

This is the season to engage in celebrating the future work and plan of God through our Messiah. It's a time where we should draw closer to him and celebrate his great love, kindness and grace. Because it is only God alone who has provided us with every opportunity to love him, bless him know him, and serve him. The future for all followers of the Messiah is only and always pure blessing from God. Our encouragement today is for everyone to take at least five minutes of your time and Give the King Messiah your undivided time and attention to tell him what's in your hearts, is it praise, is it worship, it is thankfulness or all the above. Give him your best.

Baruch Hashem, ha-noten lanu chelek malchuto ha-Nitz chit v'ha-meshi chit l'olam va'ed.

Prophetic Summary & Application

Rosh ha Shannah-Feast of Trumpets

Prophetic Significance: *The shofar symbolizes a call to gather and hear God. In Christian prophecy, it is believed that the Messiah (Jesus) will fulfill this holiday at the end of the age, when the trumpet sounds and believers are resurrected and gathered to meet the Lord (1 Thessalonians 4:16-17)*

Life Application: *Take time to pause, reflect, and listen for God's voice in your life. Just as the shofar called the people to gather and hear God, set aside moments of quiet to seek God's direction and be attentive to His calling. For example, dedicate a few minutes each day to prayer or meditation, asking God to reveal His will for you.*

Yom Kippur-Day of Atonement

Prophetic Significance: *Jesus is seen as the ultimate High Priest who fulfilled the atonement through his sacrifice. In the future, it is believed that Israel will recognize Jesus as Messiah and be saved at the end of the tribulation period (Romans 11:26; Matthew 23:29)*

Life Application: *Practice sincere repentance and seek forgiveness—from God and from others. Use this season as an opportunity to examine your heart, confess your shortcomings, and make amends where needed. For instance, reach out to someone you may have wronged and ask for their forgiveness, or spend time in prayer confessing your sins and accepting God's grace.*

Sukkot-Feast of Tabernacles

Prophetic Significance: *Symbolizes God dwelling with humanity. In prophecy, Sukkot points to the future Messianic Kingdom, when Jesus will reign from Jerusalem and all nations will be required to honor him during this feast (Zechariah 14:17). The eighth day represents the eternal state, when God will dwell with his people forever (Revelation 21:1-5).*

Life Application: *Celebrate God's provision and presence in your daily life. Remember that God is your provider and desires to dwell with you. You might do this by expressing gratitude for your blessings, sharing a meal with family or friends, or spending time outdoors to reflect on God's faithfulness—just as the Israelites lived in booths to remember God's care during their journey.*
