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## COURSE OVERVIEW

Section	Description
<b>Purpose</b>	This document outlines a 1:1 speaking course based on a curated film collection focused on travel, relocation, identity, and life abroad. The goal is to build confident, fluent spoken English through dialogue analysis and structured grammar practice using authentic film scenes.
<b>Target Level</b>	A2–B1 students who want to transition toward confident B1–B2 spoken fluency.
<b>What's Inside</b>	LESSON PLAN (how one lesson works) · COURSE PLAN (8 films × 3 lessons) · MODULE RESULTS (skills + quantitative result)
<b>Format</b>	2 lessons per week · 24 lessons total · 3 lessons per film
<b>Duration</b>	12 weeks

<b>Film Selection</b>	The films listed above are personally recommended and curated by the course author. Students may propose alternative films, provided they match the target level and thematic focus (travel, cultural adaptation, identity transformation, life transitions).
<b>Structure</b>	Each film is divided into three analytical stages: Context → Conflict → Transformation. Two lessons per week ensure structured progression and language recycling.
<b>Adaptation</b>	Speaking tasks and grammar focus are adjusted individually within A2–B1 progression.
<b>Workbook</b>	Students receive structured materials including selected subtitles, vocabulary lists, guided retelling tasks, scene-based exercises, and visual grammar algorithms.

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## LESSON PLAN — EXAMPLE

### PREPARATION (BEFORE THE LESSON)

Step	Task
①	Watch the assigned film segment with English subtitles.
②	Highlight key travel- and relocation-related expressions.
③	Write a structured retelling (Where? Why? What changed?).
④	Extract 5–10 reusable expressions.
⑤	Identify the emotional turning point of the scene.
⑥	Complete focused grammar practice for the week.

**Goal:**

Comprehension · Contextual vocabulary activation · Structured narrative preparation

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**AT THE LESSON (60 MINUTES)**

**Structure:** 45 minutes speaking · 15 minutes correction

<b>Step</b>	<b>Activity</b>
①	Warm-up discussion (relocation, identity, cultural contrast).
②	Structured retelling of the segment.
③	Dialogue mechanics analysis (intention + conflict).
④	Scene reconstruction / role play.
⑤	Language algorithm extraction (travel & life-abroad patterns).
⑥	Grammar correction and task review.

Extended speaking · Emotional vocabulary expansion · Context-based grammar application
