COURSE OVERVIEW

Section	Description
Purpose	This document outlines a 1:1 speaking course based on <i>House of Cards</i> . The goal is to develop structured B2-level spoken English through analysis of political strategy, negotiation tactics, and institutional power dialogue.
Target Level	B1 students aiming to reach confident B2 spoken fluency in analytical, strategic, and formal communication.
What's Inside	LESSON PLAN (structure of one lesson) · COURSE PLAN (24 lessons) · MODULE RESULTS (skills + quantitative result).
Format	2 lessons per week · 24 lessons total · 1 module.
Duration	12 weeks.
Series Selection	Episodes explore political ambition, betrayal, media manipulation, lobbying, and institutional power struggles.
Structure	Each episode is analyzed through: Strategic Objective → Political Obstacle → Tactical Maneuver → Power Shift.
Adaptation	Speaking tasks focus on negotiation language, persuasion strategies, institutional vocabulary, and high-level argumentation.
Workbook	Students receive structured subtitles, political vocabulary glossaries, strategic dialogue breakdowns, scenario simulations, and grammar algorithms for formal reasoning.

LESSON PLAN — EXAMPLE

PREPARATION (BEFORE THE LESSON)

Step	Task
①	Watch the assigned episode segment with English subtitles.
②	Highlight political and strategic expressions.
③	Prepare structured retelling (Objective → Conflict → Outcome).
④	Extract 5–10 reusable formal expressions.
⑤	Identify the turning point in the power dynamic.
⑥	Complete focused grammar practice (Conditionals, Passive Voice, Reported Speech, Modal verbs).

Goal:

Analytical vocabulary activation · Strategic reasoning · Formal tone precision

AT THE LESSON (60 MINUTES)

Structure: 45 minutes speaking · 15 minutes correction

Step	Activity
①	Warm-up discussion (power, loyalty, political ambition).
②	Structured analytical retelling.

- ③ Dialogue mechanics analysis (intention → leverage → pressure → outcome).
- ④ Negotiation role play (media manipulation, back-channel deal, political threat).
- ⑤ Language algorithm extraction (persuasion frameworks, diplomatic phrasing).
- ⑥ Grammar precision upgrade.
