COURSE OVERVIEW

Section	Description
Purpose	This document outlines a 1:1 speaking course based on <i>Sex and the City</i> Seasons 1–2. The goal is to develop confident, emotionally nuanced spoken English through dialogue analysis, relationship vocabulary expansion, and structured grammar application in adult social contexts.
Target Level	B1 students aiming to transition toward confident B2 conversational fluency.
What's Inside	LESSON PLAN (structure of one lesson) · COURSE PLAN (24 lessons based on Seasons 1–2) · MODULE RESULTS (skills + quantitative result).
Format	2 lessons per week · 24 lessons total · 1 module.
Duration	12 weeks.
Series Selection	Episodes are selected to explore dating culture, commitment fears, independence, friendship loyalty, and modern relationship psychology.
Structure	Each episode is analyzed through: Question → Relationship Conflict → Emotional Resolution.
Adaptation	Speaking tasks focus on expressing opinions, emotional reactions, disagreement, boundaries, and personal values.
Workbook	Students receive structured subtitles, vocabulary glossaries, guided retelling tasks, discussion prompts, and grammar algorithms.

LESSON PLAN — EXAMPLE

PREPARATION (BEFORE THE LESSON)

Step	Task
①	Watch the assigned episode with English subtitles.
②	Highlight relationship-related vocabulary and emotional expressions.
③	Prepare structured retelling (Question → Conflict → Outcome).
④	Extract 5–10 reusable discussion phrases.
⑤	Identify the main emotional turning point.
⑥	Complete focused grammar practice (Conditionals, Modal verbs, Present Perfect, Reported Speech).

Goal:

Emotional vocabulary activation · Opinion-building · B2 discussion fluency

AT THE LESSON (60 MINUTES)

Structure: 45 minutes speaking · 15 minutes correction

Step	Activity
①	Warm-up discussion (relationships, dating norms, independence).
②	Chronological retelling of episode events.

- ③ Dialogue mechanics analysis (intention → insecurity → emotional payoff).
- ④ Debate or role play (boundary setting, confrontation, confession).
- ⑤ Language algorithm extraction (softeners, hedging, emotional phrasing).
- ⑥ Grammar refinement and clarity upgrade.

Emotionally precise speech · Argument clarity · Mature conversational tone
