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## COURSE OVERVIEW

Section	Description
<b>Purpose</b>	This document outlines a 1:1 speaking course based on <i>Suits</i> . The goal is to develop confident B2-level spoken English through analysis of corporate negotiations, strategic manipulation, ethical dilemmas, and fast-paced professional dialogue.
<b>Target Level</b>	B1 students aiming to reach confident B2 spoken fluency in professional and persuasive communication.
<b>What's Inside</b>	LESSON PLAN (how one lesson works) · COURSE PLAN (24 lessons) · MODULE RESULTS (skills + quantitative result).
<b>Format</b>	2 lessons per week · 24 lessons total · 1 module.
<b>Duration</b>	12 weeks.
<b>Series Selection</b>	Episodes explore corporate litigation, internal firm politics, loyalty conflicts, leadership power shifts, and identity concealment.
<b>Structure</b>	Each episode is analyzed through: Legal Objective → Conflict → Tactical Move → Power Outcome.
<b>Adaptation</b>	Speaking tasks focus on negotiation language, corporate vocabulary, persuasion strategies, confrontation control, and authority tone management.

**Workbook** Students receive structured subtitles, business-law vocabulary lists, guided retelling tasks, negotiation simulations, and grammar algorithms for structured reasoning.

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# LESSON PLAN — EXAMPLE

## PREPARATION (BEFORE THE LESSON)

Step	Task
①	Watch the assigned episode with English subtitles.
②	Highlight negotiation and corporate expressions.
③	Prepare structured retelling (Goal → Conflict → Strategy → Result).
④	Extract 5–10 reusable professional phrases.
⑤	Identify the key leverage moment.
⑥	Complete focused grammar practice (Conditionals, Passive Voice, Modals, Reported Speech).

**Goal:**

Professional vocabulary activation · Strategic reasoning · B2 grammar upgrade

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## AT THE LESSON (60 MINUTES)

**Structure:** 45 minutes speaking · 15 minutes correction

Step	Activity
①	Warm-up discussion (loyalty, ambition, ethical compromise).

- ② Structured case retelling.
- ③ Dialogue mechanics analysis (intention → leverage → threat → concession → win).
- ④ Negotiation role play (closing a deal, internal conflict, client persuasion).
- ⑤ Language algorithm extraction (power phrasing, ultimatum structures).
- ⑥ Grammar precision and fluency upgrade.
