| Purpose | This document outlines a 1:1 speaking course based on <i>The Good Wife</i> . The goal is to develop structured B2-level spoken English through courtroom dialogue analysis, argument construction, and advanced grammar application in professional legal contexts. |
| Target Level | B1 students aiming to reach confident B2 spoken fluency in analytical, professional, and persuasive communication. |
| What's Inside | LESSON PLAN (how one lesson works) · COURSE PLAN (24 lessons) · MODULE RESULTS (skills + quantitative result). |
| Format | 2 lessons per week · 24 lessons total · 1 module. |
| Duration | 12 weeks. |
| Series Selection | Episodes explore litigation strategy, evidence, persuasion, ethics, negotiations, and political pressure. |
| Structure | Each episode is analyzed through: Legal Goal → Evidence / Obstacle → Argument Strategy → Verdict / Consequence. |
| Adaptation | Speaking tasks focus on legal reasoning, structured argumentation, cross-examination language, and formal registers. |

Workbook Students receive structured subtitles, legal vocabulary lists, guided case retelling prompts, debate tasks, role-play trials, and grammar algorithms for precise reasoning.
