

Example Lesson Structure

Below is an example of how one lesson in the English with Movies program is structured. Each lesson is built around one episode or film fragment and follows a consistent learning sequence.

Preparation (Before the Lesson)

Students prepare independently using structured materials.

- watch the assigned episode or film segment with English subtitles
- highlight key expressions and phrasal verbs
- complete short preparation tasks
- identify the main situation and emotional turning point
- prepare a few conversational phrases for discussion

Goal: vocabulary activation, natural speech rhythm, understanding context and humor.

During the Lesson (60 minutes)

Each session focuses primarily on active speaking.

Structure:

- speaking warm-up related to the episode theme
- chronological retelling of events
- dialogue mechanics analysis (intention, reaction, subtext)
- vocabulary activation in conversation
- contextual grammar correction in real time

Most of the lesson is devoted to active speaking practice.

After the Lesson

Students consolidate vocabulary and prepare for the next episode.

- short vocabulary review
- optional writing task based on the episode situation
- preparation for the next episode or film segment

Result Over Time

Because vocabulary naturally repeats across episodes, students gradually activate a large number of expressions in real speech while improving listening comprehension and conversational confidence.
