---

#### Squire Pauley Sr

On October 30, 1837 Squire received a land grant for 25 acres on the west fork of Little Coal River in Logan County, Virginia.

Information about Squire's family from Boone County Vitals and Kith & Kin, Vol.1. On Feb. 9, 1853 Squire buys 310 acres on west fork of Little Coal River "up west fork to the upper end of the bottom on which said Pauley's house now stands ... and ... 500 acres below the mouth of the Big Ugly running up Big Ugly one mile ..." Sold by the "heirs at law of James Brown, deceased - Joseph Halstead and Margaret, John B. Miller and Delilah, Wilson S. Granville, et al. See Land records of Boone County book 182.

Squire and his sister Dolly married a brother and sister. His wife Catharine Brown is the sister of Dolly's husband William Brown. 4/10/2010 - unable to locate a listing in WV Marriage Records.

The 1840 Federal Census for Logan County, Virginia shows Squire Pauley as a head of family with two males under five, 1 male 5 and under 10, one male 20 and under 30, one female under 5, and one female 20 and under 30. Squire's father Samuel is listed on the same page.

During the Civil War, four of Squire and Catherine's sons, Calvery, James, Rufus and GW, served in the Confederate army and all returned home. Calvery and Washington enlisted on the same day into the same unit. Squire Jr., their youngest son at the time, served for several months in the state guards at the end of the war.

1870 Federal Census for the Crook District of Boone County, West Virginia - Post Office listed as Bald Knob  
Squire Pauley, 58, WM, Farmer; Katharine Pauley, 57, WF, Keeping House; Malinda Pauley, 20, WF; Floyd Pauley, 18, WM; Preston Pauley, 16, WM; Martha Bradley, 3, WF (not sure who she is). On the same page as separate families are Rufus and Squire Jr.

On 1 June 1878 Squire married Letha Jarrell in Boone County. The handwritten marriage register lists them both as widowed. His age is given as 56 and hers as 32. He is listed as having been born in Kanawha County and she in Boone County. They were both living in Boone County at the time of their marriage. The names of their parents and husband's occupation are blank on the entire page.

His death, from Boone County Deaths, was reported by his wife Letha (sic). He died at age 81 years, 7 months, 19 days of paralysis.

### Notes for James Franklin Pauley:

#### James Franklin Pauley

The WV Marriage Index indicates that Boone County records start in 1864.

"Pvt. James Pauley, Swann's Company of 22nd Virginia Infantry: enlisted April 25, 1861 at Charleston, Kanawha County, age 27. Deserted on June 1861 roll."

Source: Book "22nd Virginia Infantry" found at Staunton, Va.

Family stories say that he served in both armies, according to Donald Pauley.

The LDS records of William Cornwall (found 10/98) indicate other children: Rebecca, b. 1865; Lewis W., b. 1867, sp. Octavia Baxter m. 6/22/1884, John D., b. 1872, sp. Alminta Unk.; Joseph E. b. 1870. All born in Kanawha Co,

At the 1860 census James was living with his parents and is listed as a farm helper.

The 1880 Census of West Virginia for Kanawha County lists James as a 46 year old laborer, with wife Sabra 40 keeping house, and children Rebecca 15, Louis F. 13, John O. 8, Nancy 3, and George W. 1. (It does not list children Malinda, Joseph L., and Sela.)

At the 1900 Federal Census, James is living in Cabin Creek with his son Lewis and his family; he is a 66 year old widower.

The family records of C. E. Pauley, in possession of Donald C. Pauley state that James died at the home of his son, Lewis Frye Pauley in Mammouth, Kanawha County, West Virginia.

The death certificate of James' son Lewis F. Pauley indicates that James was born in Boone County.

### Notes for Calvery Pauley:

---

#### Calvery Pauley

Some records show his first name spelled Calvary.

At the 1860 census Calvery is living with his parents and is listed as a Farm Helper.

There is a Calvery Pauley listed in 1st Regiment, Virginia State Line (Cavalry) of the Confederate Army in the Civil War. Name: Calvery Pauley; Residence: Boone Co., West Virginia; Occupation: Farmer; Enlistment Date: 20 Sep 1862; Enlistment Place: Boone Co., West Virginia; Side Served: Confederacy; State Served: Virginia; Service Record: Enlisted as a Private on 20 September 1862 at the age of 26. Enlisted in Company B, 1st State Line Regiment Virginia on 20 Sep 1862. Enlisted in Company A, 45th Battn Infantry Regiment Virginia on 6 May 1863; Height: 6' 0"; Eye Color: blue; Hair Color: light; Complexion: light. The web site for the 45th Virginia Infantry Regiment, Confederate States Army (1861 - 1865) Roster does not list Washington or Calvery Pauley.

The National Archives' Company Muster Roll (copy in file) lists Calvary Pauley as a Private in Company B, 1st State Line Cavalry for Dec. 31, 1862, to March 31, 1863; enlisted Sept. 20, 1862, in Boone County by Capt. Elkins for a period of 12 months; last paid by Maj. Taylor, Dec. 31, 1862; noted that his name appears in the column of names present as Calvey Pauly.

Children Charles, Oscar and William are confirmed in the WV Birth Records Index. Elbert and Victory are not listed.

The 1900 census lists Calvery (age 60, born Dec. 1835) and Amanda (age 57) married 36 years; 6 total children, 4 living. His occupation is listed as Farmer. They have five children listed in the 1880 census.

### Notes for Martha Pauley:

---

#### Martha Pauley

According to her WV death record, she died 12 days after her 29th birthday during childbirth, presumably having daughter Martha, although the dates in the records are off slightly.

---

### Notes for George Washington Pauley Sr.:

---

#### George Washington Pauley Sr.

According to information in the 1984 family reunion package., GWP owned 1,500 acres of land in western Virginia, now West Virginia, rich in anthracite coal, oil, and yellow poplar timber. He sold it cheap because he

didn't like his neighbors. This land was believed to have been along the Coal River in what is now Boone County, West Virginia.

In the 1850 and 1860 censuses he is living with his parents and is listed as Washinton Pauley. At the 1870 census he is listed as Washington Pauley, a 30 year old farmer in Boone County. The value of his real estate is \$100. In 1880 he is listed again as Washington Pauley, a 40 year old farmer, still in Boone County. By 1900 he is listed as G.W. Pauley, 60 years old and his occupation is listed as contractor in Kanawha County. The home ownership fields indicate that he had a house but the rent or own and own free or mortgage fields are empty. By 1910 he is listed as George W., living in the Marsh Fork District of Raleigh County and has a home farm on rented property. In 1920 he is still listed as George W., widowed and living with two of his sons in the Clear Fork District of Raleigh County with no trade or profession listed. Based on this information it would appear that the above story is not true.

According to family lore, when he was 17 yrs. old George was taken prisoner during the Civil War by Northern troops. He and his family were so far back in the mountains that they did not know that a war was going on. Taken by train to Cairo, Illinois, he then spent time in a Chicago area prison camp where he almost died of either Cholera or Typhoid. While there he got to see President Lincoln. Research by Chester Clagett, a friend of Jeff Pauley's, indicates that this was probably Camp Douglas - considered one of the worst Union camps. Given that he was born in 1840, GW would have been in his 20s during the Civil War so I'm not sure how accurate this story really is. In my files is an interesting story of the History of Camp Douglas, written in 1878.

If he did serve in the military during the Civil War, the NPS Soldiers and Sailors web site lists several possibilities: there is a George W. Pauley and a Washington Pauley, Sr. who served in the 7th Regiment, West Virginia Cavalry (Union), three George W. Pauley's who served in Confederate units from Virginia, and two Washington Pauley listings who served in Confederate units from Virginia.

The most likely entry is the Washington Pauley who enlisted in the Confederate Army on the same date as his brother Calvery. Washington is listed as a 22 year old (this is right) farmer when he enlisted in Company B, 1st State Line Regiment of Virginia on September 20, 1862 (American Civil War Soldiers). This record then indicates that he enlisted in Company E, 45th Battalion Infantry Regiment Virginia on May 6, 1863 (also same as brother Calvery) and was AWOL from that unit on November 1, 1863, although AWOL information is suspect given the scarcity of these records. Muster records typically covered a two month period. 5'10", grey eyes, brown hair, dark complexion. The web site for the 45th Virginia Infantry Regiment, Confederate States Army (1861 - 1865) Roster does not list Washington or Calvery Pauley.

The NPS Civil War Soldiers and Sailors System states that the 45th Infantry Battalion was organized by detachments between April and December, 1863. Its six companies were composed of men from the 1st Regiment Cavalry Virginia State Line which had disbanded. The unit served in the Department of Western Virginia, lost 4 killed and 11 wounded at Cloyd's Mountain, then was involved in various conflicts in the Shenandoah Valley. It disbanded during April, 1865. Lieutenant Colonel Henry M. Beckley and Major Blake L. Woodson were in command. Washington and Calvery Pauley were first in the 1st Regiment Calvary, VSL and then in the 45th.

The National Archives' Company Muster Roll (copy in file) lists Washington Pauley as a Private in Company B, 1st (Regiment) State Line Cavalry for Dec. 31, 1862 to March 31, 1863; enlisted Sept. 20, 1862 in Boone County by Capt. (Daniel) Elkins for a period of 12 months; under remarks it states that, "gun captured by the enemy in Boone Co."

In the 1860 census Washington is living with his parents and is listed as a 21 year old farm helper.

Washington and Mary Jane were married in Wyoming County 22 December 1864. He was 24, single, born in Logan County and a resident of Boone County. She was 21, single, born in Boone County and a resident of Boone County. His parents are listed as Squire and Catherine; hers as Joseph and Mary. His occupation is listed as Farmer. They were married by William Walker.

At the 1870 Federal Census, Washington is a 30 year old farmer living in the Crook District of Boone County with his 25 year old wife Mary Jane and children William R. and Ellen K., next door to his wife's parents Salathiel and Eleanor Pauley.

Victoria Bradley 14 (house worker). She is likely the daughter of John and Martha Bradley of Raleigh County, born 10 March 1865 (ancestry.com search 2/5/2010). There is no record of her birth or marriage on the WV Vital Records website.

According to a copy of their marriage certificate (in file and attached as media), GW was married to Julia Webb on October 12, 1893 "at the residence of the bride's father" in Raleigh County, West Virginia. He was 50 and a resident of Kanawha County and she was 22 and a resident of Raleigh County. The ceremony was performed by Rev. Samuel F. Mills.

When his son Hazen registered for the draft in WW1 he indicated that his father lived in Jarrold's Valley, Raleigh County.

At the 1920 Census GW is a 79 year old widow head of household living in Clear Fork, Raleigh County with his sons GW Jr. - 36 and Hazen E. - 21.

Some sources show his birth date as 1/10/1840 however his death certificate (in file) says 1/1/1840.

Some family records show additional children of Benton, Luther and Roxie but they are not shown in the census records so I have not listed them as children here (deleted 2/26/2008).

The death certificate indicates that he died in Miami, Kanawha County. The informant was his son T.B. (Thomas Benton) who lived in Miami so he could well have been living there with his son.

### Notes for Rufus Pauley:

---

#### Rufus Pauley

The National Archives' Company Muster Roll (copy in file) lists Rufus Pauley as a Private in Company B, 1st State Line Cavalry for Dec. 31, 1862, to March 31, 1863; enlisted Sept. 20, 1862, in Boone County by Capt. Elkins for a period of 12 months; under remarks, it states that he "Deserted the service with gun and equipment."

At the 1870 Federal Census, Rufus (27) and Valera (20) are in Boone County, West Virginia. On the same page are his parents, Squire and Catherine Pauley, his older brother James and his wife, Sabra Pauley, and their children, and his younger brother, Squire Jr., and his wife, Catherine.

Rufus is listed in the 1880 Census of West Virginia for Kanawha County as a 35-year-old farmer with his wife, Valeria.

There is only one listing in the WV Marriage Index using the last names of Pauley and Hunter, but it is not Rufus.

The 1900 Federal Census lists Rufus in Cabin Creek as a 66-year-old coal miner living with his wife, Valeria, and son, Howard, age 16, also a coal miner.

By the 1910 Federal Census, they are living in Kanawha County. so we know that Howard does not have any siblings.

### Notes for Squire Pauley Jr.:

---

#### Squire Pauley Jr.

"The company of State Guards was made up of men from Raleigh, Wyoming and McDowell Counties (Virginia). Captain Turner, who commanded the outfit, was then 24 years old. He had been seriously wounded in action at Cross Keys on June 8, 1862, and was honorably discharged from the Union army. After returning to his home on Sand Lick and recovering from his wounds, he was first placed in command of a company of 50 Raleigh County Scouts, later was placed in command of the Home Guards. The Guard was discharged at Brownston, W. Va. 1st August 1865." CAPTAIN TURNERS HOME GUARD COMPANY

The Muster Role of the Home Guards in this article includes the name of Squire Pauley. Squire is also noted in a 1917 letter from William Turner to his brother John.

The Civil War Pension Index (copy in file) lists Squire Pauley as serving in Captain Turner's Raleigh County, West Virginia State Guards from March 15, 1865 to July 20, 1865 (19 years old at the time), and notes that he

died in Chesapeake, West Virginia on September 26, 1929.

At the 1870 Federal Census Squire and Catherine are in Boone County, on the same page as his parents.

(Kith and Kin lists a marriage between Squire and Letha Jarrell in 1878 but this Squire would have been born about 1822 so this would not be the same person.)

The 1880 Federal Census for West Virginia shows Squire age 32, Katherine age 30, Meredith age 4, and Millard age 1, with Squire's occupation listed as farmer.

At his 1896 marriage to Elizabeth Turner both are listed as widows.

Squire's death certificate (in file) shows his age as 85 with a birth year of 1844.

#### Leazy Pauley

From the Linville Family website:

Leanza Pauley was born circa 1847 at VA. As of 23 May 1867, her married name was Leanza Linville. She married Thomas Linville, son of Preston P. Linville and Hannah Harriett Pauley, on 23 May 1867 at Crook Twp, Boone County, WV. Leanza Pauley and Thomas Linville appeared on the census of 1870 at Bald Knob, Boone County, WV. Leanza Pauley and Thomas Linville appeared on the census of 24 June 1880 at Elk, Kanawha County, WV. Leanza Pauley and Thomas Linville appeared on the census of 1900 at Crook Twp, Boone County, WV.
