Notes for Samuel A Pauley:

Samuel A Pauley

Samuel married Martha Patsy Hill in Kanawha County in January or February 1811. Thereafter, they moved to what is now Boone County, settling on Pond Fork. Samuel and his family are listed in the 1820 census of Kanawha County as Pond Fork was still in Kanawha County at that time so they would have been in that county whether on Pond Fork or at an earlier home. Logan County was formed in 1824 and originally included Pond Fork as well as most of the watershed of Little Coal River that is now in Boone County. Samuel is not in its first list of taxpayers, dated 1824, suggesting that he had not yet come to Pond Fork. However, he and his family are in the 1830 census of Logan County (using this spelling of the last name), proving that they were living there by that time. On the same page Squire. Boone County was formed in 1847 from parts of Kanawha, Logan and Cabell Counties, and the Pond Fork area has since been in it. (Sigfus Olafson in Kith and Kin of Boone County, Vol. I)

The 1840 census of Logan County, Virginia lists Samuel Pauley (using this spelling) as head of household that includes five males and five females. Also listed on the same page are Henry Pauley, Jeremiah Pauley, Joseph Pauley, John W. Pauley, Meredith Pauley, and Joseph Pauley, Jr.

When the 1850 census was taken, all of the children of Samuel and Patsy were married, and Samuel was living with his daughter Hannah and her husband Preston Linville at the mouth of Lick Creek of Pond Fork. During or soon after the Civil War Samuel moved to near Frame in Kanawha County where two of his children were then living. Samuel and his son John appear in the 1870 census of Kanawha County but not his second wife Mary. (Sigfus Olafson in Kith and Kin of Boone County, Vol. I)

Samuel and Patsy lived on Pond Fork about eight miles from Madison, arriving there about 1825. Soon after the Civil War, Samuel moved to Frame, Kanawha County. (Boone Co., W Va History, 1990, p. 51)

According to information in the Addendum to Kanawha County cemeteries, Samuel is probably buried in the Old Pauley Cemetery with his son Daniel. He was known to be living with his son Daniel in his old age. His first wife, Martha "Patsey" Hill Pauley died in the 1840s in Boone County. He remarried in 1855 to Polly Tucker in Boone and had they one son, John, born in 1856.

Samuel's wife Martha died in the 1840s and when his children moved west he married Polly Tucker and they later joined his son Daniel in Kanawha County. Samuel was living with Daniel at the 1870 Census. (Elk River Communities, Kanawha County, 1993).

No death record at Kanawha County Clerk's Office - 4/15/10. Unable to locate in WV Death Index using wildcard search 4/20/10.

Notes for Martha "Patsy" Hill:

Martha "Patsy" Hill

At the time, Patsy was a nickname for Martha and rarely used as a given name but many of her records show the name Patsy. Patsy is not listed with Samuel in the 1850 census so it is presumed that she died before then.

Her birth location is unverified

Notes for Squire Pauley Sr:

Squire Pauley Sr

On October 30, 1837 Squire received a land grant for 25 acres on the west fork of Little Coal River in Logan County, Virginia.

Information about Squire's family from Boone County Vitals and Kith & Kin, Vol.1. On Feb. 9, 1853 Squire buys 310 acres on west fork of Little Coal River "up west fork to the upper end of the bottom on which said Pauley's house now stands ... and ... 500 acres below the mouth of the Big Ugly running up Big Ugly one mile ... " Sold by the "heirs at law of James Brown, deceased - Joseph Halstead and Margaret, John B. Miller and Delilah, Wilson S. Granville, et al. See Land records of Boone County book 182.

Squire and his sister Dolly married a brother and sister. His wife Catharine Brown is the sister of Dolly's husband William Brown. 4/10/2010 - unable to locate a listing in WV Marriage Records.

The 1840 Federal Census for Logan County, Virginia shows Squire Pauley as a head of family with two males under five, 1 male 5 and under 10, one male 20 and under 30, one female under 5, and one female 20 and under 30. Squire's father Samuel is listed on the same page.

1860 Federal Census for Boone County - Post Office listed as Ballardsville

Squire Pauley, 47, Farmer; Catharine Pauley, 46; James Pauley, 26, Farm Helper; Calvey Pauley, 24, Farm Helper; Washington Pauley, 21, Farm Helper; Rufus Pauley, 17; Squire Pauley, 15; Leanzey Pauley, 12; Malinda Pauley, 8; Floyd Pauley, 6; Preston Pauley, 4; ___ Pauley, 4/12, Male

During the Civil War, four of Squire and Catherine's sons, Calvery, James, Rufus and GW, served in the Confederate army and all returned home. Calvery and Washington enlisted on the same day into the same unit. Squire Jr., their youngest son at the time, served for several months in the state guards at the end of the war.

1870 Federal Census for the Crook District of Boone County, West Virginia - Post Office listed as Bald Knob Squire Pauley, 58, WM, Farmer; Katharine Pauley, 57, WF, Keeping House; Malinda Pauley, 20, WF; Floyd Pauley, 18, WM; Preston Pauley, 16, WM; Martha Bradley, 3, WF (not sure who she is). On the same page as separate families are Rufus and Squire Jr.

On 1 June 1878 Squire married Letha Jarrell in Boone County. The handwritten marriage register lists them both as widowed. His age is given as 56 and hers as 32. He is listed as having been born in Kanawha County and she in Boone County. They were both living in Boone County at the time of their marriage. The names of their parents and husband's occupation are blank on the entire page.

His death, from Boone County Deaths, was reported by his wife Letha (sic). He died at age 81 years, 7 months, 19 days of paralysis.

Notes for Hannah Harriet Pauley:

Hannah Harriet Pauley

Hannah apparently died before Preston as her name is not mentioned in claiming any rights to the land that Preston owned at his death. (Boone Co., WVa History, 1990, p.47)

Notes for Daniel Pauley:

Daniel Pauley

Listed in the 1860 Annotated Census of Kanawha County, Jarrett's Ford District, family # 1334. Daniel, farmer, 45; Cynthia, 45; Adam, farm laborer, 19; William, farm laborer, 16; Mary Ann, 14; Austin, 12; John, 9; George, 7; Daniel W., 4. All born in Virginia.

Listed in the 1880 Census for the north side of the Elk District in Kanawha Co. as a farmer.

The acreage for the Old Pauley Cemetery was bought by Daniel Pauley in 1855 from John T. Reynolds and his wife Mary H. The Pauley family lived for a time in the Reynolds' log house on the property, according to notes in the Addendum to Kanawha County cemeteries.

The Old Pauley Cemetery is located on a point of land above the road on the curve just before the Pauley Chapel. Burial was discontinued here about 1894 when the present cemetery was established. It is assumed that the first burial was about 1845.

Thompson and Elizabeth (Pauley) Canterbury, and Daniel and Cynthia, came as a family group from Boone County and settled in Frame, (W) Va in 1855. "Daniel first bought 100 acres at Little Sandy Creek from John and Mary Reynolds on January 16, 1855. He later accumulated 672 acres on Little Sandy and 120 acres located on Poca River. His sons took turns living on the Poca River property after their marriages. Daniel first lived in the log house built by John Reynolds for a few years, and then built another of logs across the creek. In later years a frame house was built on the same site or, more probably, the log house was incorporated into the frame house. They had brought their furniture overland to Brownstown (now Marmet) and then down the Kanawha River by barge. At least one piece of their furniture survived until about 1930 when the last house was sold. A surviving relative related in the 1970s that at that time the original cherry tester bed that had been brought down the river was taken out into the yard and chopped up for firewood. She said also that a number of Daniel's son William Pauley's law books were brought from the attic and left in the yard to be soaked by rain and snow, and finally disintegrated."

(Elk River Communities, Kanawha County, p. 3-4, 1993) This same source also listed his year of death as 1888 and year of marriage to Cynthia Canterbury as 1838.

Notes for Dolly Pauley:

Dolly Pauley

Dolly's husband, William Brown, was the brother of Catherine Brown who was married to Dolly's brother Squire.

Notes for Joseph P. Pauley:

Joseph P. Pauley

The 1860 Census of Boone Co. as compiled by Sigfus Olafson indicates that he was born in Logan County, VA.

The 1880 Census as annotated by S. Olafson shows them living in Boone Co. with just their two youngest children.

The Pauley Bias Cemetery is located on the old Ballard Pauley farm on Spruce Laurel and was started by Ballard Pauley and Dave Bias, his brother-in-law. The oldest marker is that of Joseph Pauley, son of Samuel Pauley. Although intended as a family cemetery, others are there also. This was especially true when the flue epidemic hit while the big band mill was in operation at Stark, WV. There is a section of unmarked graves thaken up entirely of babies who died during this time.

Notes for Preston Pauley:

Preston Pauley

Sigfus Olafson notes in Kith and Kin of Boone County, Vol. 1, that Preston's date of death is Oct. 25, 1854.

A Preston Pauley received a land grant on 6/30/1847 for 25 acres on Pond Fork of Cole/Coal River in Logan County, Virginia. Another was received on October 1, 1849 for 65 acres on Pond Fork of Little Cole River in Boone County. Not positive if this is the same person but he is the most likely.

Notes for Lewis Pauley:

Lewis Pauley

Listed in the 1860 Federal census for Ballardsville P.O. in Boone County, VA; farmer with real property valued at \$300 and personal property of \$150. With him are his wife Frances (44), Samuel (18), Tacy (15), Susan (13), Letha (10) and Joseph (2).
